MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: POLICY 045- Restriction of Imagery and Photography Activities on Fort Huachuca.

1. References.

- a. 50 U.S.C. 797, Penalty for Violation- of Security Regulations and Orders.
- b. 18 U.S.C. 793, Gathering, Transmitting or Losing Defense Information.
- c. DA Msg, 24175Z March 08, Subject: ALARACT 087 – Prohibition on Commercial Image Collection and Surveillance.
- d. AR 190-13, The Army Physical Security Program, 25 February 2011.
- e. AR 360-1, The Army Public Affairs Program, 25 May 2011.

2. Purpose. To establish Fort Huachuca policy and procedures for photography and videography activities. Providing for the defense of this military installation in a post 9/11 environment is of the highest concern. Commanders have the responsibility and authority to enforce appropriate security measures in order to ensure the protection of DoD property and personnel assigned, attached or subject to their command. The intent of this policy is to balance the security needs of the installation with the freedom of those living, serving, and enjoying recreational or command events. Good judgment and common sense should always be applied to any situation.

3. Applicability. This policy applies to all persons entering, assigned to, in temporary duty status, or employed on Fort Huachuca. The policy applies to dependents, visitors, and guests. Violation of this policy may subject the individual to adverse administrative action and punishment under the UCMJ, or applicable provisions of the United States Code. Individuals found violating this policy may be barred from further entry onto the installation.

4. The following activities are not permitted on Fort Huachuca without prior written authorization from the Garrison Commander (GC), or designated representative. Requests for authorization should be routed through the DPTMS, Antiterrorism Officer (ATO), and/or the Public Affairs Officer (PAO).

- a. No commercial photography, videography, or global positioning surveys.
- b. No person may photograph or videotape critical facilities and/or infrastructure, designated restricted areas, High Risk Targets (HRT's), Mission Essential Vulnerable Areas (MEVA's), Access Control Points, Vehicle Search Areas.
- c. No photographing and videotaping of Child Development Centers (CDC), Child Youth School Services (CYSS), and other Morale, Welfare, and Recreation facilities unless during special events, and with prior written authorization.
- d. No picture taking or video images around housing when such pictures or images include name identification with rank and address. Non-residents should not be taking photographs in housing areas without prior permission from DPTMS (AT/OPSEC). Patients in medical facilities will not be photographed or videotaped.
- e. No picture taking or video images that may be construed as intelligence gathering. See reference 1(b).

5. Permissible imagery collection.

- a. Safety Office, Public Affairs Office (PAO), Directorate of Public Works (DPW), and DPTMS, including Visual Information personnel conducting official duties, are permitted to take photographs, make videos and collect other forms of imagery.
- b. External media must be escorted by authorized PAO/AT/ or DES personnel at all times while on Fort Huachuca. A list of authorized escorts for media access will be on file with the PAO and Police Dispatch.
- c. Service members and Family members are permitted to take pictures and videos in and around their immediate quarters. The prohibitions of paragraph 4 apply.
- d. Those serving and residing at Fort Huachuca are permitted to take pictures and videos at community events, sporting events, unit organizational functions, family gatherings, ceremonies, and at landmark locations. This includes parents taking photos of their children at CDC/Child Youth School Age Service activities. When hosting guests, Fort Huachuca residents and employees will monitor the activities of their guests, and report any violations of this policy to the appropriate authorities.
- e. Graduation ceremonies, including celebratory photographs and videos in the immediate vicinity of the graduation facility, and at locations not otherwise excluded.


f. Questions concerning the permissibility of photography and videography should be directed to the DPTMS Antiterrorism Office at 520-533-6995 or the Public Affairs Office at 520- 533-1850.

7. All requests for photography by outside agencies and organizations will be routed by the receiving organization to the Garrison Antiterrorism Officer in DPTMS for appropriate staff actions.

8. Individuals in violation of this policy are subject to immediate questioning as well as confiscation of any notes, photographs, digital imagery, sketches, maps, cameras, photography equipment or other material describing the installation. Violators may also be subject to prosecution under state, federal or military law.
