

Welcome

You will find during your stay here that the post and its neighboring communities can provide all the goods, services and facilities to make your tour enjoyable.

The city of Sierra Vista, which annexed Fort Huachuca into its boundaries in 1971, is a growing community where a number of personnel assigned to the post reside. Huachuca City, located just north of the post, is also the home of many of the post's personnel.

Within short driving distances are the mining towns of Bisbee and Tombstone, the "Town Too Tough To Die." In addition to local and Tucson stores, shoppers also frequent Nogales, Naco and Agua Priete, Mexico, all within an hour-and-a-half drive from the post.

Fort Huachuca enjoys a moderate climate. Although there may be occasional snow, the temperature during the winter will generally range from a low in the mid-30s in the morning, to the 50s during the day. Summer temperatures range from overnight lows in the 60s to highs in the mid-90s. The average rainfall is approximately 15 inches. The post's elevation is approximately 4,800 feet, with the mountains ranging to 8,410 feet.

On the pages that follow, you will find important information about in-processing, post services, your unit and local communities, as well as a directory of post telephone numbers. We hope this material will be useful to you, not only now, but throughout your stay at Fort Huachuca.

MAIN GATE WELCOME CENTER

New arrivals and visitors to Fort Huachuca should enter the installation through the Main Gate at the west end of Sierra Vista's Fry Boulevard and the intersection with Buffalo Soldier Trail.

The Main Gate Welcome Center is open Monday-Friday from 7:30

a.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is closed on weekends and holidays.

The Welcome Center can provide temporary and permanent on-post vehicle registration and information on where to locate troop units, and general information about the installation along with a small map to guide visitors to their destination. To obtain a vehicle registration permit, you must provide a valid driver's

license, vehicle registration and proof of vehicle insurance.

A Service Officer from the Disabled American Veterans, Fry Chapter 14, is usually available to assist veterans needing help with VA claims, rides, etc. The DAV telephone number is 458-5776 to coordinate times and pick-up points for veterans having appointments in the Tucson Veterans Administration Medical Center.

REPORTING IN

Officers should sign the register at the organization to which they have been assigned.

Newly assigned enlisted soldiers should report to the Battalion or Brigade S-1 of the unit to which they are assigned, during or after duty hours as follows:

RESERVIST:

Individual Reservists, regardless of rank, will report to the G-3 Reserve Support Office in Room B-18 of Building 31122 (Alchesay Barracks) for in-processing on the first duty day after arrival. phone number for the Fort Huachuca Army Lodging Office is (520) 533-2222 or (520) 533-5631. The Fort Huachuca Staff Duty NCO can be reached at (520) 533-2624.

On the first duty day after arrival, all reservists should report to the Reserve Forces Office, Building 22214 (second floor), or call 533-1584 for in-processing.

IN-PROCESSING SERVICES:

New arrivals start in-processing at their respective units or activities. The unit will make an appointment for soldiers to process at the Personnel Processing Center in Whitside Hall, Building 41330, near the Smith Avenue traffic circle. The center offers one-stop service to all incoming and outgoing permanent party soldiers. Services include the processing of personnel records and travel pay.

The travel computation personnel of the Defense Military Pay Office handle such matters as permanent change of station travel reimbursement and pay and allotment changes.

NEWCOMERS' ORIENTATION

A monthly Newcomers' Orientation for soldiers, family members, and DA Civilians is held at Murr Community Center. The orientation includes a tour of the local area. Call Army Community Service at

533-2330 for information concerning date and time.

HOUSING

The Family Housing Office, located in Building 41415, is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays.

The Housing Referral Branch for off-post housing, also located in Building 41415, is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. during normal duty days. All arriving and departing military personnel are required to process through this branch.

Personnel arriving after duty hours, on weekends or on holidays should report to the Billeting Office, Building 43083, near the LakeSide Activities Centre, for temporary lodging. They should report to their assigned unit the following day.

ARIZONA VEHICLE REGISTRATION

Individuals who place a child in school, purchase property or are employed in Arizona are required to register their vehicles in Arizona. Although nonresident military personnel have the option to register their vehicles in their home state, they may register their vehicles in Arizona. Soldiers who do so should obtain a nonresident affidavit, which is available at the Vehicle Registration Office, by presenting their latest Leave and Earnings Statement (DA Form 3686-1) and vehicle registra-

tion/bill of sale or contract for resident verification.

For vehicle registration, personnel must have proof of ownership, such as a title, if the vehicle has been registered in a title state; a manufacturer's statement of origin if the vehicle was purchased outside the continental United States; or a notarized bill of sale. In addition to the proof of ownership, the previous registration, if any, must be presented. At the time of registration, a vehicle identification inspection is made. The old license plates will be surrendered upon request. The cost for vehicle resident registration in Arizona is computed from a factory list price, prorated to the year of first registration.

ARIZONA DRIVER'S LICENSE

The Sierra Vista Regional Service Center for the Motor Vehicle Division of the Arizona Department of Transportation is located at 5224 E. Charleston Road in Sierra Vista. The center is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and closed on weekends and all legal holidays.

Drivers who establish residency in the state are required to hold an Arizona driver's license. Military family members who accept employment in the state must also obtain an Arizona driver's license. The cost for a driver's license for automobiles is based on your age: 16-39 = \$25.00; 40-44 = \$20.00; 45-49 = \$15.00 and 50 and over = \$10.00. Those who surrender a valid out-of-state license need only take a written test and an eye examination. Those with an expired license of more than 12 months must take a Class B Driver's Test and a Written Examination.

Services available Monday - Friday are Vehicle Inspections, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.; Class B Driver's Test and Written Test, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.; Motorcycle and CDL Written Test, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.; CDL Road Test by appointments only; and Motorcycle Skills Test, Tuesdays 8:30-11 a.m.

The minimum age to apply for a learner's permit is 15 years and seven months. Those applying for a driver's license must be at least 16 years old. Minors must have proof of birth and parental signatures.

HISTORY



“A camp which is a tent city is an expensive way to shelter troops and supplies. Constant replacement of canvas is costly... I recommend that... permanent buildings be erected (at Huachuca) and a garrison of some strength assigned here.”

FORT HUACHUCA

Fort Huachuca is a product of the Indian Wars of the 1870s and 1880s. In February 1877, Colonel August V. Kautz, commander of the Department of Arizona, ordered that a camp be established in the Huachuca Mountains. This camp would offer protection to settlers and travel routes in southeastern Arizona while simultaneously blocking the traditional Apache escape routes through the San Pedro and Santa Cruz valleys to sanctuary in Mexico. A temporary camp was established at the post's current location on March 3, 1877, by Captain Samuel Marmaduke Whitside with two companies of the 6th Cavalry. The site was selected because it had fresh running water, an abundance of trees, excellent observation in three directions and protective high ground essential for security against Apache tactical methods. Camp

Huachuca was redesignated a fort in 1882.

In 1886, General Nelson A. Miles designated Fort Huachuca as his advance headquarters and forward supply base for the Geronimo campaign. Geronimo's surrender in August 1886 practically ended the Apache danger in southern Arizona. The Army closed more than 50 camps and forts in the territory, but Fort Huachuca was retained because of continuing border troubles involving renegade Indians, Mexican bandits and American outlaws and freebooters.

In 1913, the 10th Cavalry "Buffalo Soldiers" arrived and remained almost 20 years. The 10th Cavalry joined General John J. Pershing in the 1916 expedition into Mexico and, during World War I, it was assigned the mission of guarding the United States-Mexico border.

By 1933, the 25th Infantry Regiment had replaced the 10th Cavalry as the main combat unit for the fort.

The 25th, in turn, was absorbed by the 93rd Infantry Division during World War II. When the 93rd departed for the Pacific in 1943, the 92nd Infantry Division arrived at the fort for training and subsequent assignment to the European Theater. During the war years, the troop strength reached 30,000 men at the fort, which in the 1930s had been described as suitable for a brigade-sized unit of about 10,000 men.

At war's end, the fort was declared surplus and transferred to the State of Arizona. It was reactivated during the Korean War by the Army Engineers.

A new era began in 1954 when control passed to the Chief Signal Officer, who found the area and climate ideal for testing electronic and communications equipment. The importance of the fort in the national defense picture grew steadily from that moment. In 1967, Fort Huachuca became the headquarters of the U.S. Army Strategic Communications Command.

Then, in 1971, the post became the home of the U.S. Army Intelligence Center and School, bringing with it the School Brigade.

The Strategic Communications Command became the U.S. Army Communications Command in 1973, subsequently changing to the U.S. Army Information Systems Command in 1984, and to the U.S. Army Signal Command in 1997. On Oct. 1, 2002, The U.S. Army Signal Command was renamed the U.S. Army's Network Enterprise Technology Command.

In October 1990, the post changed hands when the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command became the new host command; the U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca now operates the post.

Today, Fort Huachuca is the major military installation in Arizona, and one of prominence throughout the Southwest.

THUNDER MOUNTAIN

The post sits at the base of the Huachuca Mountains. That name comes from an obscure, local Indian language which, when loosely translated, describes a “place of thunder.”

Thunder Mountain is the nickname of choice among locals and it’s accurate as well, depending on the time of year. The sight of dark clouds cascading down the mountainside while electricity, thunderclaps and water fill the air can be as awesome to modern man as it must have been to ancient Indians. The name must have referred to the visual spectacle rather than its frequency because, actually, Thunder Mountaineers enjoy some of the mildest and best weather found in Arizona.

The original Fort Huachuca cantonment was declared a National Historical Landmark in March 1977 during a four-day centennial celebration. A rustic wooden sign sits on the northeast corner of Brown Parade Field, the center of post life during the days of horse soldiers. Surrounding Buildings and homes are maintained with the appearance and flavor of the old days.

HISTORICAL MUSEUMS

When Whitside led his column from the 6th Cavalry into southern Arizona and into the annals of history, he could scarcely be aware that the temporary post he was ordered to establish in the foothills of the Huachuca Mountains would survive to play a major role in the drama of the western United States.

This fascinating history of the U.S. Army in the Southwest, as well as the history of the Southwest itself, unfolds at the Fort Huachuca Historical Museum. Opened in 1960, the museum has grown rapidly and now houses one of the most representative collections in the state. The museum has been accredited by the American Association of Museums. The Fort Huachuca Historical Museum endeavors to bring to the military community and general public a heightened awareness of, and an increased appreciation for, the colorful history of the Southwest and, especially, the prominent part played by the U.S. Army.

The exhibits are instructive, entertaining and aesthetically satisfying. Some of the U.S. Army manuscripts and documents, dating back as far as 1861, can tell the viewer a great deal about the way of life on a rugged frontier.

The museum, in Building 41401, is open to the public without charge. Civilian visitors are welcome. Hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 1 to 4 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. A leisurely walk through the museum has proven to be an enriching and stimulating experience for the

thousands of guests who visit each month.

A Museum Annex across the street from the Fort Huachuca Historical Museum was officially opened in 1982, adding much-needed space to display some of the artifacts belonging to the museum. The renovation and reconstruction of the building, formerly a theater, took approximately two years to complete.

Now there is a second museum on Fort Huachuca, the U.S. Army Intelligence Museum, located just down the street from the Fort Huachuca Museum. It looks at the development of the military intelligence profession within the U.S. Army and has in its collection a segment of the Berlin Wall, the “black box” used on a space mission to take pictures of the earth’s surface, prototype code machines, as well as a number of other artifacts relating to Army intelligence. It tells the stories of men like Arthur Wagner, Ralph Van Deman, Parker Hitt and Charles Young, who led U.S. Army intelligence into the 20th Century and account for it being the second largest officer’s branch in today’s Army.

SERVICES & FACILITIES

ADJUTANT GENERAL DIRECTORATE

The Adjutant General Directorate (AGD) recently implemented several changes to streamline soldier in/out-processing procedures. These efficiencies are more soldier-friendly and have reduced the time required for soldiers to process in and out of Fort Huachuca.

The new procedures for in-processing allow soldiers to tailor their processing to meet their individual and family needs. Some mandatory stops (Personnel, Finance, MEDDAC, CIF, Army Substance Abuse Program) still exist. However, many of these mandatory stops are within a small footprint and within walking distance (see map). Also within the footprint are several optional stops, depending on soldiers' needs/interests. To expedite the process further, many agencies which previously required long information briefings have condensed their information into customer hand-outs/fact sheets that are available at Whitside Hall.

A soldier's first stop to in-process remains his/her unit of assignment. Soldiers must sign in from leave at their unit. The unit then performs unit-specific processing in conjunction with Post Security and DOIM. The unit prepares a duty position assignment memorandum and makes the soldier an appointment to in-process, Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m., at Whitside Hall. Soldiers in-processing must have the following items in their possession: MPRJ; Finance, Medical, Dental, and Education records; duty position assignment memorandum; ID card and tags; unit in-processing checklist; DA Form 31; assignment orders, to include amendments and endorsements; latest NCOER/OER (E5 and above); and promotion packet (if on the E5/E6 promotion list). The only other mandatory stops are at Central Issue Facility, MEDDAC, and Murr Community Center, where soldiers will receive mandatory briefings on TRICARE and PPIP (Put Prevention into Practice) on the first Tuesday after arrival on post.

The new out-processing procedures also save soldiers considerable time. The key to the time-saving is the DAISM (Department of

the Army Installation Support Module) system. This program allows agencies to electronically pre-clear departing soldiers up to 160 days prior to PCS, ETS, or retirement. If an activity does not indicate a need to see a soldier, then AGD will clear soldiers and allow them to depart Fort Huachuca. Soldiers can help this process work for them by ensuring that open business accounts with agencies (such as books checked out of the library) are closed out once they receive their official orders. The Education Center, DENTAC, and the Veterinary facility are also helping to reduce mandatory out-processing stops by delivering soldier records to Whitside Hall three days prior to the final out-processing appointment. These streamlined procedures leave only two mandatory stops (CIF and MEDDAC) outside of the processing footprint.

ARMY SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM

The Fort Huachuca Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP), is located in Building 22414. The program provides education, prevention, rehabilitation and biochemical testing services.

Eligible groups include active duty military, the civilian workforce, retirees, and the families of each group. The education and prevention services are for on- and off-post communities upon request. It also provides newcomer briefings to military and civilian personnel. Specialized training and other services are available to military and civilian supervisors.

Counseling services include outpatient individual and group, clinical evaluation, referral for inpatient treatment, and guidance to individuals and families on intervention techniques when a family member (or other) has an alcohol or drug problem. Services are confidential except when otherwise limited by law or regulation. Information on individuals in the program is protected by federal policies on confidentiality.

AMERICAN RED CROSS

The American Red Cross serving Fort Huachuca has established a new toll-free number for active duty military members needing emergency communication services. Active duty military members and their family members residing in the same household should call 1-877-272-7337 to reach the Armed Forces Emergency Service Center in Fort Sill, Oklahoma. Red Cross Armed Forces Emergency Services, with the help of its military partners, is responsible for delivering emergency messages to military men and women around the world.

The new AFES service centers' use of the newest and most advanced communication technology available and the use of the toll-free number will give active duty military members enhanced access and more timely Red Cross emergency assistance than ever before. Now all military members and their families who are assigned to domestic installations will have around-the-clock access

to Red Cross emergency services nationwide through a toll-free call.

The new Armed Forces Emergency Service Center will make it much simpler for active duty military members to access the Red Cross emergency communication system without having to visit or contact the Red Cross office on their military installation or call their local Red Cross chapter. The center at Fort Sill manages calls within 26 western states. A second center in Falls Church, Va., manages all calls within a 12-state area along the East Coast as well as overseas and fleet-based emergency communications.

Fully operational in June 1999, the Armed Forces Emergency Service Center at Fort Sill serves as the Red Cross emergency communications center for 42 military installations in the midwestern region of the United States.

For those interested, the Red Cross offers classes designed to meet the needs of the whole family. Learn to Swim classes, Lifeguard, Guardstart and other aquatic classes are available. They offer a full line of CPR/First Aid classes to include Community First Aid and Safety, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, and Emergency Response. Babysitters' Training and other childrens courses are also available. Classes are held both on Fort Huachuca and at Red Cross office in Sierra Vista.

The American Red Cross has volunteer opportunities available that range from doing work in the local office, to being on a local disaster team or helping teach classes

in CPR and First Aid. Volunteers on Fort Huachuca also work at the Health Center and assist with the Blood Drives.

The American Red Cross office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. or call 458-4858

ARMY CAREER AND ALUMNI PROGRAM

The Army Career and Alumni Program is a commander's program that meets the needs of transitioning soldiers, civilians and their family members as directed by congressional law.

The ACAP program process is a carefully designed series of services that inform and assist transitioners in securing the help they need to transition successfully. For the military, the transition starts with a pre-separation briefing. Attendees learn about career options, transition benefits and the services available to assist them. Attendees continue their ACAP involvement by visiting the ACAP Center to register for additional services.

Pre-separation: All transitioning soldiers are required by law to enroll in ACAP. Retirees may enroll two years prior to projected retirement date and all others may enroll one year prior to separation date.

Work Shop: The workshop covers job search skills such as resume and application development, dressing for success, interviewing skills, researching companies, networking, and considering and negotiating job offers. Clients are then encouraged

to personally meet with professional counselors to develop and hone skills learned in the workshop and to use the computer workstations for developing resumes and researching job opportunities on the Internet.

Job Assistance: After completion of the workshop, transitioners may schedule individual counseling session. Counselors help job seekers identify an objective, write cover letters, complete applications, find job opportunities, prepare for interviews and job fairs, and negotiate for salary and benefits.

Veterans Affairs: The ACAP Center offers periodic VA Briefings.

ACAP is located in Building 22420, in the Old Post area. Hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. For information on Federal job opportunities and general information on the ACAP services, call 533-7314. To make an appointment for Pre-Separation Briefings, and three-day workshops, call 533-5764. ARMY COMMUNITY SERVICE

As the commander's "Partner in Readiness," the Fort Huachuca Army Community Service, in Building 50010 on Smith Avenue traffic circle is dedicated to helping military personnel and their family members.

Through outreach to all military units, ACS provides information, assistance and guidance to members of the community and helps those members to better meet personal and family problems beyond the scope of their own resources. The ACS sponsors a variety of programs.

The Family Advocacy Program provides information, training, and support to families on child and spouse abuse prevention. Classes are aimed at education in the prevention of child and spouse abuse and are presented to troop and the community.

Information on consumer affairs, as well as financial planning and assistance, is available through ACS. It assists with consumer complaints, checkbook and budget management, and debit liquidation,

and offers budget counseling and consumer awareness classes.

The Standard Installation Topic Exchange Service (SITES) provides informative, extensive information on military installations worldwide. Welcome packets for Fort Huachuca are also available.

To ease the stress and expense of relocation, the Lending Closet loans household items for temporary use. These include dishes, cookware, high chairs, cribs and small appliances.

Army Community Services centralizes many resources to solve problems affecting the morale and well-being of members of the military community. Army Family Team Building provides information and training about the military community. Classes are designed for all spouses of active duty and reserve soldiers and civilians. For additional information, call 533-3686. The Family Services Program provides training for Family Readiness Groups. The office is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For additional information, call 533-5919. The Information, Referral, and Follow-up Program provides ready access to information on resources available to soldiers and family members. Employment assistance is provided to eligible personnel in finding public and private sector employment.

ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF

The Army Emergency Relief Office is located in Building 50010 at the Smith Avenue traffic circle.

The AER was organized during the early part of World War II by popular demand. Army members sought an agency of their own to which they could turn for assistance in emergencies.

Accordingly, AER was organized to collect, hold and disburse funds for this purpose. Its motto, "The Army Takes Care of Its Own," has been proudly supported since its beginning by both active and retired members of the military and their families.

Those eligible for AER assistance include soldiers on extended active

duty and their dependents, Reserve component soldiers (ARNG and United States Army Reserve) on continuous active duty for more than 30 days and their dependents. This applies to soldiers on active duty for training or serving under various sections of title 10, United States Code. Also, soldiers retired from active duty for longevity, retired by reason of physical disability, or retired at age 60 under section 1331, title 10, United States Code and their dependents, as well as surviving spouses and orphans of eligible soldiers who died while on active duty or after they were retired as identified above.

The AER works hand-in-hand with the American Red Cross and relief organizations of the Navy and Air Force.

In recognition of a need that exists for Army members, AER established an undergraduate educational assistance program as a secondary program to that of providing emergency financial assistance. The educational assistance program is designed to assist dependent children of Army personnel who need financial assistance to pursue post secondary level study, to include vocational training, preparation for acceptance by service academies and college education.

Army Emergency Relief emergency assistance is extended by

cash grants, non-interest-bearing loans repaid by allotment, or both.

Personnel who need emergency assistance from AER should first report their problems to their unit commanders. The AER Officer or the officer's assistant will then conduct an interview. If all conditions of AR 930-4 are met and the situation warrants, AER will extend assistance.

ARMED FORCES BANK

Armed Forces Bank operates two full-service branches on Fort Huachuca. The Main Bank is located in Building 52035. BUFFALO SOLDIER EDUCATION/TRAINING CENTER

The Buffalo Soldier Education/Training Center provides adult educational programs as part of the worldwide Army Continuing Education System (ACES). The ACES mission is to provide quality education and training opportunities in support of the total Army goals, to enhance

the quality of life within the entire military community, and to offer personal growth experience through career development and other voluntary education and training programs.

Depending on services needed, eligible clients include all assigned active duty military personnel, Department of Defense civilian employees, contractors and adult family members.

The wide range of ACES programs and services includes vocational and educational counseling, functional academic skills training, GT improvement, college and Army personnel testing, Army learning center/MOS library support, undergraduate and graduate college programs, financial assistance/information, and computer laboratory and computer classroom resources for educational training purposes. Qualified, professional counselors can help clients set realistic, yet challenging educational and vocational goals. The ACES counselors provide all the information necessary to develop a plan of action to meet personal and professional goals.

The Center provides extensive testing services as a part of the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) network. The College Level Examination Program (CLEP), American College Testing Program, and many other tests are available to military personnel at no cost. College credit may be awarded for successful completion of many of these tests. Army personnel tests are also available.

The ACES is the Armywide proponent for Army Learning Center support. COMMISSARY





EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The Equal Employment Opportunity Office (EEO) has the primary staff responsibility for advising the Commanding General on the compliance requirements for the USAIC & Fort Huachuca's EEO program. The Special Emphasis Program, Affirmative Employment Program and the Complaints Program make up the components of the EEO office. The overall purpose of the EEO program is to establish and maintain a work environment free of discrimination. The guide provides trail locations on both topographical and drawn maps of the 11 major hiking trails (approximately 43 miles) in the Huachuca Mountains. Some trails on post are overgrown or faint, and require good pathfinding skills.

INSPECTOR GENERAL

Inspectors General are an extension of the eyes, ears and conscience of their commanders and report upon the mission accomplishment, state of discipline, training and readiness, and morale of their commands. Inspectors General gather information through the use of inspections, investigations, and by processing requests for assistance or complaints from the military and civilian communities.

Raymond W. Bliss Army Health Center is one of the largest and most modern health care facilities in Cochise County. In early 2001, we received a three-year accreditation with commendation from the Joint

NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS ACADEMY

Since 1988, the Military Intelligence Noncommissioned Officers Academy has called Fort Huachuca home. The mission of the NCO Academy is to increase the leadership and technical competencies of Military Intelligence Noncommissioned Officers making them capable of accomplishing diverse missions in any environment.

The NCO Academy conducts the Basic Noncommissioned Officers Course (BNCOC) and the Advanced Noncommissioned Officers Course (ANCOC). Both BNCOC and ANCOC are conducted in two phases. Phase 1 is a standardized 12-day Stand Alone Common Core (SACC) course that teaches and reinforces soldier and military leadership skills without regard to the NCO's military occupational specialty (MOS). BNCOC students are

promotable Sergeants or newly promoted Staff Sergeants. BNCOC Phase 2 consists of 13 MOS specific courses ranging from three to 13 weeks, depending on the MOS.

These courses teach advanced technical skills specific to the NCO's MOS and intermediate leadership skills to prepare the NCO to be a Team Leader or Squad Leader. ANCOC students are promotable Staff Sergeants or newly promoted Sergeants First Class. ANCOC Phase 2 is six weeks of higher-level military intelligence and senior leadership training to prepare the NCO to be a Platoon Sergeant or Section Leader. ANCOC is not MOS specific and this gives the senior NCO an opportunity to learn about and interact with the other intelligence disciplines.

DIRECTORATE OF PUBLIC SAFETY (PROVOST MARSHAL)

The Directorate of Public Safety (DPS) is located in building 31043.

The mission of the DPS is to provide quality law enforcement, and fire services to the Fort Huachuca community. The directorate is comprised of two divisions: the law enforcement division, which includes physical security, traffic supervision, military police investigations and liaison with surrounding civilian law enforcement agencies.

The law enforcement division is primarily responsible for the security of the installation and enforcement of rules, regulations, and laws governing the Fort Huachuca community.

The fire division is primarily responsible for fire prevention and education, environmental stewardship and provides emergency medical services (EMS) in response to on-post 911 calls.

CURFEW POLICY

The military police strictly enforce the installation curfew policy. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a parent or under adult supervision between the hours of 10 p.m. - 5 a.m. Children 16 and 17 years old must be accompanied by a parent or under adult supervision between the hours of midnight - 5 a.m. A curfew permit can be obtained from the military police and the Youth Services Activity Center. The permit authorizes children to travel unaccompanied during the hours of the curfew from one specific location to another as designated by the parent or guardian. A parent or legal guardian must sign the permit.

MILITARY POLICE

The military police support a variety of community-based programs and services. They provide assistance in crime prevention, D.A.R.E. Program for children in on post schools, McGruff the crime dog events, and upon written request will give classes for special unit events and functions on safety and child related issues (bike safety, fingerprinting for children and crime prevention). For more information contact 533-2839.

and suspicious activities and disturbances. To report traffic accidents and request military police non-emergency assistance contact the military police in Building 22336. The telephone numbers are 533-2181 or 538-COPS (2677). The military police desk operates twenty-four hours a day. All personnel should keep these phone numbers available.

MOTORCYCLE REQUIREMENTS

Motorcycle operators must complete a motorcycle safety course (accredited through the motorcycle safety foundation) or possess proof of completing an equivalent program within the last five years. All persons operating motorcycles on post must wear a properly fastened department of transportation approved helmet, clear goggles or attached face shield, full-fingered gloves, long trousers, long sleeve shirt or jacket, bright-colored garments during daylight, retro-reflective garments at night, leather or over the ankle shoes. The use of head/earphones while driving is not authorized. Headlights must be activated at all times.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION/ WEAPONS REGISTRATION

Vehicle registration/Weapons Registration is required on Ft. Huachuca. Personnel living on post must register their privately owned firearms within 72 hours of residing in quarters. Barracks residents must store their weapons in their respective unit's arms room. Registration hours are Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. hours at Whiteside Hall, Room 4, Building 41330. For more information, call 533-1840 or 533-0897.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The Garrison Public Affairs Office, located in Building 21115 on Adair Avenue at the west end of Brown Parade Field, conducts the post's command information, public information and community

relations programs. The Public Affairs Officer is the official spokesperson for Fort Huachuca.

The primary source of command information for installation personnel is *The Fort Huachuca Scout*, a weekly civilian enterprise newspaper with a press run of approximately 8,200 copies. The *Scout* is delivered to staffs and organizations, as well as within the housing areas on post. Individuals with information of interest to the readership of the *The Fort Huachuca Scout* newspaper can call 533-1987.

Another source of command information is the Commanders Access Channel. Operating on Channel 97, Thunder Mountain Radio and Television is available to all cable television subscribers on post and in Sierra Vista. It broadcasts music, news, and information from Soldier's Radio and Television Network. Information on local events is also aired. During times of emergency or increased force protection levels, everyone is encouraged to tune to the Commander's Access Channel for up-to-date information on operating hours and other items of common interest. During an emergency or period of increased force protection, all administrative announcements will be cancelled and only information about the current situation will be aired.

The PAO prepares news releases for use by local, regional and national media as part of the public information program. All inquiries by the news media regarding the post and its activities should be referred to the PAO at 533-1287.

Another responsibility of the PAO is community relations with post activities and community organizations, such as speaking engagements by installation leaders. For information about our Community Relations programs, call 533-1285.

Because of the number and variety of organizations on Fort Huachuca, most activities or units

RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES

Fort Huachuca has an active chapel program for military personnel, civilian employees, retirees and their family members. The Installation Ministry Team is composed of chaplains, chaplain assistants, civilian employees, contractors, and many volunteers from the community. Together, they provide a comprehensive and lively religious life program.

The post's chapel worship schedule includes Collective Protestant Worship, a Protestant Gospel Service, Roman Catholic Masses, Eastern Orthodox, Jewish, and Muslim services. Local community churches offer many more denominational services.

The largest of the two chapels on Fort Huachuca is the Main Post Chapel, located at the corner of Lawton Road and Smith Avenue. Built in 1973, this handicapped-

accessible facility houses a 600-seat chapel, religious education classrooms, multi-purpose meeting room, watch care facilities, a Blessed Sacrament Chapel, a spacious kitchen, chaplain and administrative offices and an extensive religious library. Kino Chapel, on Kino Avenue, is a 300-seat chapel with chaplain and administrative offices, as well as conference/activity room. Prosser Village Chapel Annex, located on the corner of Bissel and Stein, houses the MI Battalion Chaplains and their Chaplain Assistants.

The Installation Ministry Team provides a wide range of religious support, which includes services, rites, weddings, funerals, memorial services, baptisms, patriotic observances, and seasonal religious celebrations. RETIREMENT SERVICES

The Retirement Services Office provides assistance for more than 17,000 retired Army members and their families, to include widows and widowers within Arizona. SCHOOLS

The Fort Huachuca Accommodation School District includes kindergarten through eighth grade. A Resource Room Program is available for children with special needs in all three schools and classes are taught by certified special education teachers. Speech therapy is available for pupils who require it. Title I and an English Language Learner Program is also available.

The school district operates a Special Needs Preschool for three-, four-, and non-kindergarten five-year-old children. Children in the program may participate in motor, cognitive and language activities specifically suited to their needs. Speech, physical and occupational therapy is also available when appropriate.

The school system is operated in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona and is under supervision of the Cochise County School Superintendent.

Students are registered at the school which houses their particular grade level.

Myer School, located on Smith Avenue between Arizona and Burns Streets, houses all preschool, kindergarten, fourth- and fifth-grade classes.

Johnston School, located on Rucker Street between Winrow Road and Smith Avenue, houses all first-, second- and third-grade classes.

Smith School, located at the intersection of Smith Avenue and Cushing Street, houses all sixth-, seventh- and eighth-grade classes.

High School, students residing on Fort Huachuca are transported off post to attend Buena High School (515-2800) in the Sierra Vista School District.

THRIFT SHOP

OPERATIONS CENTER

The West Civilian personnel Operations Center (WCPOC) is located in Greely Hall, Room

2202. The WCPOC mission is to provide civilian personnel support to 32,000 customers throughout the United States; this includes classification of civilian positions, recruitment and provision of lists of candidates to managers, delivery of training, and processing of civilian personnel actions into the defense civilian database. The WCPOC does not generally work directly with customers, but provides this support through close working relationships with Civilian Personnel Advisory Centers (CPAC) who interface directly with applicants, employees and managers and obtain support from the CPOC. Customers should contact the local CPAC on the installation for information, advice and assistance.

ADMINISTRATION

SATELLITE OFFICE

The Veterans Administration operates a satellite office in the ground floor (basement) of the Raymond W. Bliss Medical Clinic, to serve veterans in Southeast Arizona and Cochise County. The office telephone number is 533-2526 (3-2536 on post). To make an appointment at this clinic, veterans must first call the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Tucson at 1-800-470-8262, which in turn will schedule your visit and ensure your medical records are available from Tucson to the local clinic. This process is necessary to ensure each veteran is scheduled to be seen by the correct clinic or medical personnel. Since the local clinic is small, some of the specialize care clinics are only available in Tucson. Veterans visiting the satellite office at Fort Huachuca are advised to park in front of the Raymond W. Bliss Medical Clinic. If needed a shuttle service is available to transport individuals to the VA clinic.

Housing

Fort Huachuca has 1,649 units. Of that total, 215 units are designated as officers' quarters, and 1,434 units are listed as adequate enlisted quarters.

Housing construction includes Historic, Wherry, MCA and Capehart. All family quarters on post are equipped with refrigerators and ranges. Cable television can be connected for a nominal monthly rate. Telephone service for quarters is available through U.S. West Communications.

Senior officers reside in a row of large adobe quarters along Grierson Avenue. These two-story homes date from 1884 and are part of the old cavalry fort now listed as a State and National Historical Landmark.

The post has nine different housing areas:

Cavalry Park 1-5 – General, senior and field grade officer quarters.

Signal Village 3, and Cavalry Park 6 – Company grade officer quarters.

Bonnie Blink and Gatewood Housing 4 – Quarters for senior-non-commissioned officers from E-7 to E-9.

DeAnza Village, Miles Manor, Pershing Plaza (East and West), Coronado Village, Signal Village 2 and Gatewood Housing 2 & 3 – Quarters for enlisted personnel from private to staff sergeant.


The communities of Sierra Vista, Huachuca City, Tombstone, Bisbee and Benson provide a selection of housing for military and civilian personnel. Available facilities include apartments, duplexes, mobile homes and single-dwelling houses. There are no mobile home facilities on post.

Billeting facilities are provided for persons either on permanent

change of station (PCS) or temporary duty (TDY) orders. All TDY guests have access to 216 recently renovated and redecorated quarters with private baths and kitchens, as well as to distinguished visitor quarters in the historical section of post. Over 2,000 barracks rooms and bachelor officer quarters, either new or upgraded, are available for single persons permanently locating






U.S. ARMY INTELLIGENCE CENTER AND FORT HUACHUCA

Fort Huachuca became a Training and Doctrine Command installation in 1990 through the consolidation of the U.S. Army Intelligence Center and School with the U.S. Army Garrison as part of the Base Realignment and Closure Act.

Training and Doctrine Command was formed in 1973 with headquarters at Fort Monroe, Virginia. As a major command, TRADOC has soldiers and civilians serving at installations and activities across the nation. Its primary missions are to prepare the Army today for war on tomorrow's battlefield and to be the architect of the future Army.

The U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca is responsible for Army Intelligence as well as Garrison functions.

U.S. ARMY INTELLIGENCE CENTER

In modern warfare, the force that has the fastest, most accurate intelligence will be the victor. The sophistication of today's combat systems will mean almost certain destruction or neutralization of any element that can be located on the battlefield. In this environment, it is essential that the United States be able to find and identify enemy forces and determine their intentions and capabilities quickly and precisely, while denying the enemy similar information. The Army must have the best possible intelligence system.

Providing this system is the mission of the Intelligence Center. With its subordinate elements, it is the originator of the Army's military intelligence structure, the source of all its trained manpower, and the developer and tester of its systems and equipment. The Center is the focal point of the Army's effort to meet its present and future intelligence collection and processing requirements.

Fort Huachuca became the home of Army Intelligence in 1971 when the Intelligence School moved from

Fort Holabird, Md. Since its inception in 1955, the school's mission has been to train selected personnel and to perform intelligence and security duties in the fields of imagery, interrogation, counterintelligence, area studies and combat intelligence. In 1973, the Intelligence School combined with the combat surveillance portion of the Combat Surveillance/Electronic Warfare School and the U.S. Army Combat Developments Command Intelligence Agency to form the first true U.S. Army Intelligence Center and School.

This amalgamation added combat surveillance aspects to the school's academic instruction and gave the Center an expanded combat and training development role. On July 1, 1987, the 25th anniversary of the Military Intelligence branch, the MI Corps was activated as part of the U.S. Regimental System at Fort Huachuca.

The headquarters for the Intelligence Center is located in Rodney Hall. From this location, the commandant, who is also the commanding general of the Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca, as well as chief of the MI Corps, directs activities here and at other locations throughout the United States.

The principal functions of the Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca are divided among several organizational elements.

The 111th Military Intelligence Brigade provides command and control for a yearly average of 6,000 students and more than 2,500 permanent party. Brigade headquarters is located at Riley Barracks.

The brigade consists of three MI battalions and one detachment. Two battalions are located at Fort Huachuca. The third battalion is at Goodfellow Air Force Base, Texas, with one company detached to Pensacola Naval Air Station, Fla.

The brigade's mission can be stated in three parts. First, produce trained, physically ready noncommissioned officers and soldiers for the total force through initial entry training in all military intelligence enlisted fields and sergeants major battalion and brigade command designees. Second, prepare combat ready soldiers to deploy, fight and

win. Third, take care of soldiers, their families, civilians and retirees. The 111th MI Brigade stands ready to deploy trained units and individuals to meet contingencies throughout the world.

The Headquarters and Headquarters Company mission is the command and control, administrative and logistic support for the brigade headquarters.

The Development, Training and Test Detachment for the Joint Surveillance Target Acquisition Radar System (JSTARS) is located in Melbourne, Fl. It is the developmental center for all testing, evaluation and demonstrations of the JSTARS. Its contingency mission is to deploy army aircrews and ground station module crews in support of worldwide operations.

The 304th MI Battalion mission is to provide training, testing, maintenance and equipment support to the Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca. The battalion operates Libby Army Airfield where it trains all Intelligence Electronic Warfare (IEW) Special Electronic Mission Aircraft (SEMA) crews in IEW operations and unique flight characteristics of SEMA vehicles. The battalion also operates the National Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) Test Center. At the center, doctrine and testing in UAV operations is developed and soldiers and Marines are trained in UAV operations and maintenance. All IEW equipment and its maintenance is provided by the 304th.

Mission of the 305th MI Battalion is to train signal intelligence soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines, and leaders in the tactical and strategic equipment that they will be exposed to in the field. Students are trained in IEW maintenance at both the tactical and strategic level, as well as in national and theater level collection systems.

Mission of the 309th MI Battalion is to train intelligence analysts, imagery analysts, ground surveillance radar operators, interrogators and multi-discipline counterintelligence agents.

The 344th MI Battalion at Goodfellow AFB, Texas, has the mission of developing and executing training in signal intelligence analysis,

voice intercept, non-morse intercept, maintenance and advanced image intelligence.

Mission of the 326th MI Battalion is to train officers in basic and advanced military intelligence skills, focusing on providing timely intelligence to commanders. Additionally, the battalion trains warrant officers and officers of foreign nations. The 326th is also home to the Advanced Training Division which provides automation support, prototype training, infrastructure planning and simulations for the entire Intelligence Center.

FUTURES DEVELOPMENT INTEGRATION CENTER

The Futures Development Integration Center (FDIC) is setting the vision for the Military Intelligence Corps that is focused on: designing and fielding the total Military Intelligence Force, Active Component and Reserve Component, developing Military Intelligence concepts, organizations, systems and training to provide quality Intelligence and

Electronic Warfare support to Battalion, Brigade and Joint Task Force operations, and implementing a seamless Military Intelligence Force from "Echelons Below Corps" through "Echelons Above Corps" fully capable of operating in Joint and Combined environments.

111TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BRIGADE

The 111th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade provides command and control for a monthly average of 3,100 cadre and students combined. Brigade headquarters is located at Riley Barracks. The Brigade consists of three battalions, an Air Force training squadron, a Marine detachment, and a Naval Technical Training Center detachment. Two of the battalions, the training squadron, and the three sister service detachments are located on Fort Huachuca. The other battalion is located at Goodfellow Air Force Base, Texas, with one company located at Pensacola Naval Air Station, Fla.

The 111th MI Brigade's mission is to train soldiers to be Military Intelligence professionals who possess the commitment, character, skills, and spirit needed to help fight and win our country's wars and accomplish its strategic goals. In order to accomplish this mission, the brigade must develop training that is relevant to the present and future needs of the Army and Joint Force.

HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY

The Headquarters and Headquarters Company mission is to provide personnel, logistics, vehicle maintenance, IEW maintenance, and administrative support for the 111th MI Brigade Headquarters.

The 305th, 309th, and 344th MI Battalions are initial training units. They receive soldiers, Marines, sailors, and airmen from basic training and the Defense Language Institute and provide them with basic intelligence training. These units continue providing soldiers with basic combat skills to prepare them for follow-on assignments.

305th MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BATTALION

The 305th Military Intelligence Battalion, located in Hitt Hall Building 81401 in the MI Village complex, was reorganized on June 28, 2001. Subordinate to the 111th MI Brigade, the mission of the battalion is to quickly train soldiers to standard to be technically com-

petent Military Intelligence soldiers who live by the Army values, and are prepared to take their place in the ranks of the Army while focusing on Army transformation and efficient soldierization. The battalion is composed of three subordinate companies which train an average student load of over 400 soldiers in five separate Military Occupational Specialties (MOS).

Focused on quickly producing the highest caliber MI soldier for the warfighter, the battalion leads, trains, and administratively supports all assigned and attached soldiers.

Alpha Company serves as the Headquarters Company and trains the 96D Imagery Analyst and 98J ELINT Analyst courses utilizing fully digitized methods and instruction. Bravo Company is responsible for

teaching the 33W Intelligence Electronic Warfare Systems Repair Course. The 33W course is one of the most extensive courses taught at Fort Huachuca, encompassing over 40 weeks of classroom and hands-on instruction. Echo Company is the largest of the three companies and trains the 96U Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Operators Course, the 96H JSTARS Common Ground Station Operators Course, and the Special Electronic Mission Aircraft (SEMA) Aviator Qualification Course.

The 305th MI Battalion is also responsible for operating and managing the unique and extremely diversified Libby Army Airfield. The airfield is unique to the US Army because it is used jointly by military activities as well as serving as the civilian airport for the City of

Sierra Vista and surrounding communities. As such, military and civilian aircraft share the runways, taxiways, navigation aids and Air Traffic Control facilities. Civilian operations are concentrated on the north side of the airfield and include a passenger terminal. Military operations are concentrated on the south side of the airfield, accessible from Fort Huachuca from Brainard Road, Gerstner Road, and Arizona Street. Airfield facilities and services available to both military and civilian users include crash/rescue, three lighted runways, Air Traffic Control, Approach Radar, and Airport Surveillance Radar. Local Military operations at Libby Army Airfield include the RC-12 SEMA fixed wing military aircraft as well as the HUNTER and

SHADOW unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) assigned to the battalion. The diversification of the airfield comes through the multitude of other permanent and tenant organizations, both military and civilian, that utilize Libby Army Airfield for operations such as: the Army Electronic Proving Ground, the U.S. Air Force, the Arizona National Guard, the U.S. Forest Service, the U.S. Customs Service, and the U.S. Border Patrol to name a few.

Upon receipt of assignment to the 305th MI Battalion, newly assigned personnel are encouraged to visit the 305th MI Battalion homepage located on the Fort Huachuca Web site for additional information and points of contact.

309TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BATTALION

Also located at Fort Huachuca is the 309th MI Battalion. The battalion's mission is to train soldiers using state-of-the-art technology and methods to be technically competent Military Intelligence soldiers who live by the Army Values and are prepared to take their place in the ranks of the Army and Joint Force. The battalion manages courses for Intelligence analysts, Ground Surveillance System Operators, Counterintelligence Agents, Human Intelligence Collectors and Communication Interceptors.

344TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BATTALION

The 344th MI Battalion at Goodfellow AFB, Texas, has the mission of training soldiers to be motivated, disciplined and physically fit Military Intelligence and Firefighter professionals to meet the commanders' needs world-wide. The battalion manages courses for voice interceptors, signal intelligence analysts, and military firefighters. Company D, 344th MI Battalion located in Pensacola Naval Air Station, Fla. manages the non-morse intercept course.

The Marine Detachment, the Naval Technical Training Center Detachment, and the 314th Training Squadron are charged with the mission of providing administrative and logistical support to their Marines, Sailors, and Airmen respectively.

112TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BRIGADE

The 112th Military Intelligence Brigade was activated at Fort Huachuca on Sept. 26, 2000. The brigade is home to the 304th Military Intelligence Battalion and the 306th Military Intelligence Battalion.

The brigade mission is to train and develop Military Intelligence leaders and units that are warrior focused, capable of leading and operating in networked, digital, system-of-systems architectures throughout the entire operational spectrum.

304TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BATTALION

The 304th Military Intelligence Battalion is the home of MI leader training. You can expect a challenging and rewarding assignment that will increase your proficiency as a Military Intelligence professional.

The 304th Military Intelligence Battalion trains Military Intelligence leaders, writes tactical Intelligence and Electronic Warfare (IEW) doctrine, and prepares advanced training programs for the total force, in order to provide the Army MI leaders proficient in advanced intelligence skills.

Prior to your arrival we encourage you to do the following:

Access our homepage from the Fort Huachuca Web site. Both the Battalion and the installation have an extensive Web site that provides detailed information about the school and support facilities for soldiers and their families. If you are unfamiliar with the Internet, start learning it now; since many of our intelligence systems have similar operating features that you will be expected to be proficient with.

Study Field Manuals (FM) 34-1 (changing to FM 2-0); 34-2 (changing to FM 2-01); 34-3 (changing to FM 2-33.4); and 34-130 (changing to FM2-0.3). These are also available on the Internet.

Ensure you are in excellent physical shape, to include full compliance with AR 600-9, The Army Weight Control Program. Your company will conduct Physical Training 3-5 days per week.

Arrive at Fort Huachuca mentally prepared for training. Our courses are not designed to be easy; they are designed to make you a proficient intelligence officer commensurate with your rank and specialty. Expect demanding and rewarding work.

306TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BATTALION

The 306th Military Intelligence Battalion, located in Riley Barracks, was reorganized on July 28, 2000. Subordinate to the 112th Military Intelligence Brigade, it is composed of a Headquarters Company and Alpha Company. The 306th Mission

Statement reflects the battalion's two new priority mission. The Battalion is warrior focused. It leads, trains, and administratively supports all assigned or attached soldiers. Conducts unit training in a digital environment across the operational continuum in support of the Interim Brigade Combat Team (IBCT) and CTC Focused Rotations. Additionally, it maintains QOL for soldiers and family members.

Headquarters Company is composed of nine different sections that contain as many as 25 different MOSs. HQ Company plays a major role in the sustainment of USAIC & FH and the 306th Unit Training operations on a daily basis with sections such as the Staff Judge Advocate, Post Chapel, Inspector General, Post Equal Opportunity Office, Post Retention, Office of the Registrar, Reserve Affairs, and others. Our mission is to provide warrior focused leadership, train soldiers in warfighting skills to reverse negative trends with respect to the intelligence BOS, and support soldiers administratively. "Leaders Make a Difference, NOT Excuses!"

Alpha Company is composed of three elements – The Office of the Chief, Military Intelligence whose main tasks is to oversee the manning of the MI Corps. Futures Directorate plans for the Military Intelligence Corps for the next decades and develops doctrine to guide our Intelligence field forces to maximize our collection efforts. The TRADOC System Managers (TSM) focus on four specific intelligence functions to implement or improve our current collection assets. They include TSM UAV, TSM ASAS, TSM JSTARS, and TSM Prophet. They are involved in some of the most cutting edge technology development MI has to offer. Our mission in Alpha Company is to support our three major directorates and also train units to man the IBCT.

As our motto states, Alpha is always, "OUT FRONT AND READY!"

U.S. ARMY GARRISON

The U.S. Army Garrison manages the multitude of functions and services that keep the 73,000-acre installation operating so that other

organizations on post may concentrate on their primary missions.

The Headquarters Commandant provides support to the Garrison and exercises battalion-level command over three companies, the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, the 18th Military Police Detachment, and the 36th Army Band.

As a city unto itself, the Garrison provides support to Fort Huachuca just as any city government supports its community. For instance, the Garrison provides such services as military and civilian personnel,

legal, inspector general, logistical, facilities engineering, fire and safety, intelligence and security, housing, public affairs, resource management, internal audit compliance review and crime prevention/law enforcement. The Garrison also maintains community facilities and provides necessary services for religious, health, welfare and entertainment activities. The Garrison is responsible for maintaining Fort Huachuca's quality of life.

Because Fort Huachuca is the largest and primary Army installa-

tion in Arizona, the Garrison supports the Army Reserve and Army National Guard, as well as a number of other military activities throughout the state.

RESERVE COMPONENT SUPPORT

The Reserve Forces Office (RFO), located in Building 51005, acts as the principal advisor to the Intelligence Center and School on issues involving Reserve Component Military Intelligence. The focus of this effort is toward training and force design. Point of contact is at 533-1176 or 533-1177.

The Training and Doctrine Command Liaison NCOs are the points of contact for all Reserve Component initial entry training personnel training at the Intelligence Center. The ARNG Liaison may be reached at 533-4212. The USAR Liaison may be reached at 533-4213.

LIBBY ARMY AIRFIELD

Libby Army Airfield is unique to the U.S. Army because it is used jointly by military and civilian activities. *(Editor's Note: The last day of scheduled commercial airline service from the Sierra Vista airport was on Nov. 27, 2002. The location of the nearest commercial airport is Tucson, Ariz.)* The runways, taxiways, navigation aids and Air Traffic Control are shared by military and civilian aircraft.

Civilian operations are concentrated on the north side of the airfield, accessible directly from Arizona State Route 90. Military operations are concentrated on the south side of the airfield, accessible on Fort Huachuca from Brainard Road, Gerstner Road and Arizona Street. Civilian aviation activities at the airfield are under the auspices of the City of Sierra Vista by agreement with the Department of the Army. Airfield facilities and services available to both military and civilian users include crash/rescue, three lighted runways, Air Traffic Control, Approach Radar, Precision Approach Radar and Airport

Surveillance Radar. Available navigational aids are an Instrument Landing system, a Very High Frequency Omni Range and a Non-Directional Beacon.

The main runway is equipped with a Visual Approach Slope Indicator and the secondary runway is equipped with a Precision Approach Path Indicator. The RC-12 fixed wing military aircraft is assigned to Libby Army Airfield. The RC-12 is used by the U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca for training Special Electronic Mission Aircraft pilots and crews.

Fort Huachuca is the U.S. Army's test and training center for sophisticated Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) systems that are on the cutting edge of aerial surveillance technology. The UAVs are flown from Libby as well as two UAV runways located approximately four miles west of Libby. These vehicles share the traffic pattern and airspace with military and civilian aircraft. Military and government agencies that are permanently assigned to, or utilize Libby Army Airfield are: The U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca, the Army Electronic Proving Ground, The U.S. Air Force, the Arizona Air National Guard, the Missouri Air National Guard, the U.S. Forest Service and the U.S. Customs Service.

The airfield is operated by E Company, 305th Military Intelligence Battalion. Weather observation and reporting are provided by U.S. Air Force personnel assigned to Operating Location-C, 3rd Weather Squadron. Flight Surgeon support for aviation personnel is provided by the Military Intelligence Community Care Clinic.

U.S. ARMY INFORMATION SYSTEMS ENGINEERING COMMAND

The U.S. Army Information Systems Engineering Command (USAISEC) is headquartered in Greely Hall, with the bulk of the organizational elements operating out of the two Communications Management Engineering/Test (CMET) Buildings (53301 and 53302) located nearby.

The command acts as the Army's lead engineer of information technology, and serves as the Army's integrator and engineer for infrastructure and force projection information systems which support Army major commands and installations worldwide across the wide spectrum of strategic communications systems. USAISEC's technical expertise includes systems engineering, quality assurance and acceptance, hardware and software integration, and product evaluation.

The command's keynote to provide "Information for Decision" in a completely interoperable and seamless system, all the way from the National Command Authority into the theater/tactical environment, affords soldier and civilian employees of USAISEC frequent opportunities for travel around the world to accomplish professionally challenging missions. The headquarters supports five functionally oriented directorates located at Fort Huachuca, and four engineering field offices at Fort Belvoir, Va.; Fort Lee, Md.; Fort Detrick, Md.; and the Pentagon. Each of these elements draws on the highly educated and trained electronics engineers, communications specialists, computer engineers, computer scientists and specialists, and a variety of skilled support and administrative personnel.

USAISEC ensures that the latest technology meets the Army's stringent standards for interoperability, and that this technology is recommended for use in fielding new

systems. USAISEC therefore becomes involved in the planning and installation of specialized information systems throughout the world. The wide scope of programs includes radio and satellite systems, networks (local, campus, and wide area), command centers, desktop computers, information systems in military construction, and includes technologies such as fiber optics, Gigabit Ethernet, ATM, SONET, modeling, simulation and emulation.

USAISEC is subordinate to the Communications-Electronics Command, which is a Major Subordinate Command of the U.S. Army Materiel Command.

DEFENSE COORDINATION OFFICE-HUACHUCA

The Defense Coordination Office-Huachuca, a subordinate element of the Defense Information Systems Agency, is the principal organization responsible for provisioning Army long-haul telecommunications requirements worldwide. The office has responsibility for approximately 16,000 long-haul leased telecommunications circuits, e.g., dedicated point-to-point, special purpose, Defense Systems Network, Defense Information Systems Network, Federal Telecommunications System 2000, etc. Maintaining and servicing these accounts requires extensive technical knowledge of the latest state-of-the-art telecommunications services and equipment, e.g., modems, multiplexors, transmission systems,

transport systems, computer systems, etc.

The DCO-H is staffed by account managers that perform the technical and administrative responsibilities necessary to provision long-haul requirements for Army users worldwide. There are two divisions — the Non-Switched Systems Division, and the Switched Systems Division at 538-7904.

U.S. ARMY ELECTRONIC PROVING GROUND

The Electronic Proving Ground (EPG) was established at Fort Huachuca Ariz. in 1954. EPG is an activity of the White Sands Missile Range and the Army Test and Evaluation Command (ATEC). EPG has field offices at Fort Hood, Texas and Fort Lewis, Wash.

The mission of EPG is to support developers by planning, conducting, and reporting technical tests of new electronic systems. The systems tested include Command, Control, Communications Computers and Intelligence (C4I) systems; Electronic Warfare (EW) systems; Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) systems; and the Global Positioning System (GPS). EPG provides quality services to developers throughout the acquisition cycle. Early in the testing cycle, EPG answers many questions by modeling and simulation. Developers can address questions concerning frequency assignments, potential electromagnetic compatibility problems and the effect of electronic warfare while the equipment is in the early design stage. Later in the development, extensive measurement capabilities are available to satisfy the developer's data collection needs.

EPG operates a number of C4I test facilities. They include the Electromagnetic Environmental Test Facility (EMETF), Instrumented Test Range (ITR), Antenna Test Facility (ATF), Electromagnetic Interference/Compatibility (EMI/EMC)/TEMPEST Test Facility, Environmental Test Facility (ETF), and the GPS Test Facility. EPG also has a number of test beds to include the Communications Test Bed, the Satellite Test Bed and the Distributed Systems Test Bed.

The EMETF makes extensive use of modeling and simulation to determine the electromagnetic effects of the item being tested on the battlefield environment as well as the effects of the environment on the item being tested. The EMETF includes the Virtual Electronic Proving Ground (VEPG), Virtual Battlefield Environment Facility (VEBF), and the ability to develop and use Order of Battle Databases.

The ITR provides time-space-position information and target signals (Blue, Red and EW) for open-air testing. An extensive network of tracking and surveillance radar and range telemetry allows EPG to operate throughout Southeastern Arizona.

The ATF provides large-scale testing of antennas mounted on platforms as large as the M-1 tank and Army helicopter systems. Testing uses facilities that include the largest existing Compact Range to determine antenna radiation characteristics from high frequency to microwave frequencies.

The EMI/EMC facility offers the ability to determine the effects of new equipment on the battlefield. The importance of this knowledge is becoming increasingly valuable with the increased number of emitters appearing on the battlefield. It is only through this type of testing that the Army can be assured its systems will operate correctly.

The ETF can perform a full range of static and dynamic environmental testing on components and systems, under both operating and non-operating conditions. Testing includes temperature, humidity, salt fog, altitude, leak testing, fungus, vibration, sand/dust, solar radiation, and explosive atmosphere.

The GPS facility has the capability to do a full range of testing on GPS units using either a suite of satellite simulators or the actual deployed satellites. The test bed is part of the commercial GPS receiver test program and performs tests for both Government and private industry.

The EPG test beds offer the ability to test specific pieces of equipment/systems in environments varying from bench test to operation in a field type environment. The test beds will allow pre-test checkout of equipment and will enable the

developer to ensure the test system is ready to meet the challenges faced during formal test programs.

The EPG field offices at Fort Hood and Fort Lewis provide support to the digitization of the Army efforts. These offices support testing at the Fort Hood Central Test Support Facility and at field exercises (tests, training, or experiments) that requires the use of simulation-driven battlefield computer systems.

EPG maintains a meteorological support capability that provides weather information to the test process services to include climatology solar activity, weather forecast, and consulting services.

EPG continues to develop and update its C4I test capabilities. The EPG instrumentation program provides the research and development base to acquire improved test capabilities in support of the test mission. Efforts include requirement analysis, development of digital data collection/stimulation equipment and the development of state-of-the-art software techniques. Program emphasis is on the application of simulation and automation technologies to develop a virtual electronic test capability.

EPG's area of operation includes public and private lands in and around Fort Huachuca as well as lands available at other Government installations. The advantages of testing at Fort Huachuca include an ideal physical and electromagnetic environment and the ability to test virtually all year. U.S. ARMY COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS COMMAND COMMUNICATIONS SECURITY LOGISTICS ACTIVITY

The U.S. Army Communications-Electronics Command Communications Security Logistics Activity (CSLA) is an activity of the CECOM Logistics and Readiness Center, one of three major centers in the U.S.

Army Communications-Electronics Command headquartered at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey.

The mission of CSLA is to serve as the Army Communications Security (COMSEC) Commodity Manager on behalf of the Commanding General, CECOM and to direct the operations of the Army's COMSEC Wholesale Logistics System performing all functions of an Army Materiel Command (AMC) materiel readiness command. This includes the operation of the COMSEC National Inventory Control Point (NICP) and the COMSEC National Maintenance Point (NMP).

CSLA also serves as the Department of the Army CIO/G6 Executive Agent, Central Procurement Activity and Policy Creation Authority for information assurance (IA) products such as guards, firewalls, in-line encryptors and intrusion detection software and hardware; and as the central Army Approving Authority (AA) for the Defense Messaging System (DMS) Certification Authority Workstations (CAW).

As the HQDA Executive Agent for the Army Key Management System, the operation of the EKMS Common Tier 1 is to direct management of all COMSEC materiel through the Army COMSEC Central Office of Record, to lead the modernization of Army's COMSEC Distribution and Accounting responsible for the management

of the Army's COMSEC Modernization Program and worldwide automated Army Information Systems Security Program (ISSP) to identify Army's COMSEC requirements. CSLA directs the management of and is responsible for the conduct of Army-wide COMSEC new equipment training (NET) and customer support through a network of CSLA INFOSEC Representatives stationed in Germany; Korea; Fort Bragg, N.C.; Fort Hood, Tex.; and Fort Lewis, Wash.

The activity inspects and approves COMSEC facilities and the auditing of all Army COMSEC accounts throughout the world. CSLA also evaluates each physical, cryptographic, personnel and Controlled Cryptographic Item (CCI) incident to determine if it is an insecurity and if so, the extent of damage to national security, to serve as the principal Army COMSEC logistics point of contact for the National Security Agency (NSA).

JOINT INTEROPERABILITY TEST COMMAND

The Joint Interoperability Test Command (JITC) is a field command of the Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA). JITC's primary mission is to be the Command, Control, Communications,

Computer and Intelligence (C4I) joint and combined interoperability certification authority for DoD, to provide interoperability technical support and assessments to the Combatant Commanders/Services/Agencies (C/S/AS) and to be the Operational Test Agency (OTA) for DISA.

JITC was established in its current role October 16, 1988 as a field element of the former Defense Communications Agency (DCA), which later became DISA. In February 1992, JITC was designated a member of DoD's Major Range and Test Facility Base (MRTFB) to provide test and evaluation services to all of DoD, other federal agencies, state and local governments, and private industry.

JITC is the sole joint and combined interoperability certification authority for DoD. Certification of all DoD C4I systems with joint or combined interfaces is required prior to fielding to the warfighter.

JITC provides independent Operational Test and Evaluation (OT&E) and assessments of DISA programs to ensure that only operationally effective and suitable C4I systems are delivered to the warfighter. DISA programs include Global Command and Control System (GCCS), Global Combat Support System (GCSS), Defense Message System (DMS), Defense Information Systems Network Video Services Global (DVS-G), Department of Defense Teleport and Global Information Grid Bandwidth Expansion (GIG BE). JITC also serves as OTA for the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS), Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) and other DoD organizations/agencies.

JITC is dedicated to supporting the warfighters in the goal of C4I joint and combined interoperability and often works in-theater to provide technical support and operational assessments to the Combatant Commanders during exercises and contingencies. JITC provides 24-hour, interoperability support to the C/S/AS via the JITC hotline at 1-800-LET-JITC.

JITC is located along Brainard Road near Libby Army Airfield. JITC has a one-of-a-kind array of hardware, software, and expertise

spread over 14 separate test beds and labs. The command can interface all its on-site capabilities and networks with any other testing or operational facility worldwide. The JITC can be contacted by calling 538-5482 or 1-800-LET-JITC.

Military personnel from all four services provide operational expertise and civil service provide technical expertise in all areas of test and evaluation. This unique mix of government personnel is further augmented by highly trained contractors giving JITC the flexibility to meet growing interoperability demands.

NETWORK ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY COMMAND/9TH ARMY SIGNAL COMMAND

The U.S. Army Network Enterprise Technology Command/9th Army Signal Command is a worldwide, service-based organization, providing one coherent vision for Army Information Management.

Working with sister services, NETCOM/9th ASC provides timely delivery of critical information to our country's military and civilian leadership.

NETCOM/9th ASC is a direct reporting unit under the oversight of the Army's chief information officer, the deputy chief of staff/G6. A two-star general commands NETCOM/9th ASC, and the command a small staff located in Washington, D.C.

The command is comprised of soldiers, Department of the Army civilians and contractors on point for the nation in peace and in war.

There are more than 12,000 soldiers and civilians in 104 locations around the globe operating, sustaining and defending the Army's portion of the Global Information Grid keeping it free from hackers, viruses and other dangers.

This command ensures that the Army's portion of the Global Infor-

mation Grid is available and protected and reacts on a moment's notice to establish communications services in remote locations. The command ensures that its network components work with those from other branches of the military, providing a real-time, comprehensive view of the battlefield to the Joint Task Force.


NETCOM/9th ASC delivers seamless enterprise-level command, control, communications, computers and information technology common-user services and war fighting forces in support of the Army, its service component commanders and combatant commanders.

11TH SIGNAL BRIGADE

The 11th Signal Brigade is the Army's force projection signal brigade. It is a major subordinate command of the U.S. Army Network Enterprise Technology Command/9th Army Signal Command with the mission of providing contingency command and control communications in support of the war fighter worldwide.

Known as the Thunderbirds, the brigade's soldiers at Fort Huachuca serve either in the unit's Headquarters and Headquarters Company or the 40th, 86th, or 504th Signal Battalion. The brigade also has another battalion, the 54th, which is permanently stationed throughout Southwest Asia. The brigade has the capability to install, operate, and maintain a tactical communications network to support either joint or Army organizations, establish command center communications nodes, area signal centers, and small extension nodes. Due to its total communications capabilities, the brigade can support the full spectrum of operations to include combat, peacekeeping, and humanitarian missions.

Since 1990, the brigade has participated in numerous contingency operations. The entire brigade (less two companies that remained to execute other contingency missions) took part in Operation Desert Shield/Storm. For its service during these operations, the brigade was awarded the Department of the Army Meritorious Unit Commendation.

The brigade also took part in Operation Restore Hope and Continue Hope in Somalia from December 1992 to March 1994; Operation Intrinsic Action/Southern Watch in Kuwait from August to October 1992; and Operation Uphold Democracy in Haiti from September 1994 to March 1996. In 1998, Thunderbird soldiers deployed to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Desert Thunder. Soldiers from the brigade returned to Southwest Asia in support of Operations Desert Thunder II and Desert Fox in late 1998 and 1999.

In November 2001, the brigade deployed to the Central Command area of operations in support of the president's war on terrorism.

Brigade soldiers have also supported operations in Korea, Guantanamo Naval Base, Cuba, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and Honduras. They have provided support to Army installations in Washington, California, Texas, Arkansas, Indiana, Oklahoma, and Wisconsin. They have participated in training exercises in both Kuwait, and Egypt, as well as throughout the United States in Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, California, Nevada, Georgia, South Carolina, Virginia, Florida, Louisiana, and Massachusetts.

The principal communications capabilities of the unit include tactical satellite, tropospheric scatter, super high frequency and ultra high frequency line-of-sight radios, Tri-Band communications terminals, cable transmission systems, and voice, message, and data switches. The brigade's communications networks are compatible with the mobile subscriber equipment communications networks found at corps and division level.

Thunderbird soldiers find their time here challenging and demanding. The brigade has many different types of signal equipment, it provides unique opportunities for soldiers to participate in major field exercises and contingency operations.

UNITED STATES ARMY OPERATIONAL TEST COMMAND (USAOTC), INTELLIGENCE ELECTRONIC WARFARE TEST DIRECTORATE (IEWTD)

The Intelligence Electronic Warfare Test Directorate (IEWTD), formerly the Intelligence and Security Board, was activated at Fort Huachuca in March 1977. The organization is a subordinate command of the United States Army Operational Test Command (USAOTC) located at Fort Hood, Texas.

The U.S. Army Operational Test Command (OTC) Intelligence Electronic Warfare Test Directorate (IEWTD) at Fort Huachuca offers services from user test concept through execution and the test report on tactical intelligence,

reconnaissance and electronic attack systems. Our location here at Fort Huachuca provides an excellent environment for field-testing RF-based systems, manned and unmanned aerial reconnaissance vehicles at doctrinally correct distances. Our state-of-the-art instrumentation and threat systems are fully mobile, so that our test support services can be provided worldwide.

Most testing conducted by IEWTD is performed at Fort Huachuca to take advantage of existing range facilities, ideal climatic conditions, and the available electromagnetic environment, but, based on mission need, IEWTD is frequently called upon to conduct and participate in tests throughout the world.

FORT HUACHUCA RESIDENT AGENCY

The Fort Huachuca Resident Agency, 6th Military Police Group (Criminal Investigation Division), U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command, investigates felony-level crimes and provides investigative support for all U.S. Army elements in Arizona. The resident agency also maintains liaison with federal, state and local law enforcement agencies concerning matters of criminal investigation in which the Army has a vested interest.

The U.S. Army Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment (TMDE) Support Center provides one-stop calibration and repair of general purpose and selected special purpose TMDE. It was established in 1982 as a detachment of the U.S. Army TMDE Activity, Redstone Arsenal, Ala.

The center supports more than 170 customers including all units and organizations on post, the Arizona National Guard, and U.S. Army Reserve units in Arizona. These customers hold more than 10,000 items of TMDE.

CEREMONIAL UNITS AND ACTIVITIES

Fort Huachuca's ceremonial units consist of the 36th Army Band, Honor Guard and B Troop, 4th Regiment, U.S. Cavalry (Memorial). They participate in military ceremonies and promote U.S. Army heritage and tradition. Additionally, they support civic organizations and functions throughout the southwestern United States to strengthen Army community relations and stimulate recruiting.

B TROOP, 4th REGIMENT, U.S. CAVALRY (MEMORIAL)

The glamour and excitement of charging cavalry is only part of the reason Fort Huachuca's B Troop, 4th Regiment, U.S. Cavalry (Memorial) in the most popular unit of its kind in Arizona.

Formed in mid-1973 to keep alive the heritage and flavor of Fort Huachuca's cavalry beginnings, the troop originally was only a post ceremonial unit. Today, the members regularly attend civilian events and appear off post more often than on.

Mounted on McClellan saddles and dressed in the Army blue and gold or field garb of the 1880s — complete with sabers and carbines — the soldiers of the troop have appeared throughout the southwest. The number of appearances grows constantly, as does the number of requests. The troop has appeared in numerous Tournament of Roses Parades, centennial statehood celebrations in Montana and Wyoming, and the Holiday Bowl Parade, just to name a few.

Under its official name, B Troop, 4th Regiment, U.S. Cavalry (Memorial), the group honors a unit that served at Fort Huachuca during the 1880s. The troop has about 20 active volunteer members and many more auxiliary and associate members. Its role is the largest of all memorial military cavalry units to be found both in Arizona and the U.S. Army.

The work of the troop may appear romantic, but it is far from dreamy. In fact, for the more avid members, B Troop is practically a second full-time job, considering that most appearances are on

weekends. Many hours of preparation are spent behind the scenes for every performance. But the troopers volunteer their time freely and display the confident care, esprit and pride that come from being in the horse cavalry and knowing they are a U.S. Army and Fort Huachuca showcase unit.

POST HONOR GUARD

The Post Honor Guard is an element of the Ceremonial Detachment. It participates in ceremonial functions that take place on Fort Huachuca and throughout the southwestern United States. 36th ARMY BAND

HUNTING AND FISHING

All hunters and fishermen must be properly licensed by the Arizona Game and Fish Department. A combination state hunting and fishing license is \$44 for Arizona residents and \$177.50 for non-residents. A youth combination hunting and fishing license is available for \$25.50 for residents and non-residents alike. See current year Arizona Hunting and Fishing Regulations for details.

An Arizona hunting license as well as a post hunting permit are required for anyone carrying a privately owned firearm in the field for any purpose. Arizona general hunting licenses are available at most sporting goods stores and the Sportsman Center at \$25.50 for residents and \$113.50 for non-resi-

dents. To qualify as a resident, an individual must reside in Arizona for six months immediately preceding the date of application for a license, or be a member of the Armed Forces stationed in Arizona for at least 30 days immediately preceding the date of application.

Post hunting and fishing licenses are issued Wednesday through Sunday by the Sportsman Center for \$10 each or \$15 for a combination license. Active duty and retired military and their family members are authorized to hunt on post. Fort Huachuca civil service employees and their family members are also eligible to hunt on post. All hunters must have completed a bonafide hunter education course before hunting on post. Such a course is not mandatory for off-post hunting. Fishing is open to the general public.

Mule deer, white-tailed deer and javelina are some of the big game species hunted at Fort Huachuca. Bird hunters have their choice among three species of quail and two of dove. Special seasons and hunting areas exist for bow hunters. Mountain lion can be hunted year

round with a lion tag. No trapping is allowed on the post.

The taking of any species of animal at Fort Huachuca not specifically authorized by command directive is prohibited. Gila monsters are protected in Arizona, and the destruction of reptiles is discouraged. Three species of rattlesnake are also protected by state law: ridge-nosed, banded rock and twin-spotted rattlesnakes.

Hunting is managed according to seasons and bag limits are established by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission. Hunters are required to sign out daily with the Military Police Desk for hunting.

Fishing is available at Fort Huachuca and is open to the general public, with as many as seven ponds in years of good precipitation open to adults and children. These ponds may be stocked in winter with rainbow trout from a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service hatchery, Department of Interior.

Parker Canyon Lake is located 25 miles southwest of the post. It is a 130-acre lake maintained by the Arizona Game and Fish Department.

Because ongoing drought conditions have affected Fort Huachuca's pond significantly, anglers are encouraged to visit Parker Canyon Lake, and other lakes in the regions such as Patagonia Lake State Park.

A resident state fishing license is \$18, with a \$10.50 trout stamp required for taking trout. A non-resident trout stamp is \$49.50. All post fishermen are required to purchase a state license (\$18), trout stamp (\$10.50), and post permit (\$10) prior to fishing for trout. Those under age 14 may fish without an Arizona license when accompanied by a properly licensed adult. A juvenile fishing permit for \$3 is required for ages 9-13.

LA HACIENDA







LOCAL COMMUNITIES



“Outside the gate was a small Mexican village which consisted, in those days, of about twelve Buildings, one of which was the Building that made adobe bricks for other huts. Another one was a saloon which was closed on account of prohibition... Then there was a grocery store and... a few residences for the people who operated these Buildings.”

–Colonel Paul J. Matte, in 1927

The Grand Canyon State offers a variety of terrain and climate... from the vast desert stretches of Yuma to the San Francisco Mountains and aspen forests of northern Arizona to the wonder of man-made Lake Meade.

The wealth of beauty in Arizona is something to be experienced. The narratives that follow describe some of the nearby areas of the state that personnel assigned to Fort Huachuca are likely to visit during their stay. By no means is the list complete.

SIERRA VISTA

Adjacent to the post, Sierra Vista, at an elevation of 4,625 feet, boasts a spectacular view of the surrounding mountain ranges. The town is known for its ideal weather with an average maximum of 75 and minimum of 50 degrees. With a population of more than 37,000, it is one of the fastest growing communities in Arizona and is the business and cultural center of Cochise County.

Sierra Vista was incorporated in 1956 so, being fairly new, it is one of the most modern and vibrant cities in the Southwest. Fort Huachuca was annexed by Sierra Vista in 1972 and the military and civilian communities enjoy one of the most cordial relationships of this kind in the entire United States.

The city's school district enjoys an excellent reputation in the education community and the new Buena High School is a state-of-the-art facility. Higher education is available through Cochise Community College and the University of Arizona Sierra Vista Campus. Chapman University also offers courses in a variety of fields.

Sierra Vista is the shopping center for Cochise County and parts of northern Mexico. Several shopping plazas thrive and most major retailers are represented. Large, well stocked super markets and pharmacies along with dozens of smaller specialty shops abound. The food service industry is well represented and fine dining is available throughout the area. Entertainment and information are also in evidence with first run movies, cable television, local AM

and FM radio broadcasts and daily newspaper.

A wide variety of cultural and family oriented activities are offered during the year. The Winter Arts Festival and Art Discovery Series present a continuing program of plays, concerts, musicals, dances, recitals and readings. Other events throughout the year include the Arizona Junior Rodeo, Thunder Mountain Marathon, Huachuca Stampede Rodeo, Miss Sierra Vista Pageant, Art in the Park arts and crafts sale, Festival of Color Hot Air Balloon Rally, Family Festival, and the largest Christmas parade in the state of Arizona.

“Hummingbird Capital of the United States” is another name for Sierra Vista. In nearby Ramsey Canyon, fourteen species of hummingbirds and hundreds of other

birds, mammals, reptiles and plants may be observed and photographed. Within an easy drive are the hiking trails and breathtaking scenery of the Coronado Memorial in the Huachuca Mountains, Cochise Stronghold in the Dragoon Mountains, Chiricahua National Monument, and beautiful Madera Canyon in Santa Cruz County.

HUACHUCA CITY

Huachuca City is a community located just north of Fort Huachuca. The town began to develop with the reopening of Fort Huachuca in 1954 and was then known as Huachuca Vista. The town was incorporated in 1958 under the name of Huachuca City. Currently, it has a population of approximately 2,000.

The city has a mayor-council form of government and provides the residents with local police and fire protection. Huachuca City has one elementary school with kindergarten through eighth grade. High school students attend classes in Tombstone.

Housing available in the area consists of single-family dwellings, apartments and mobile homes. Residents are about 10 to 20 minutes driving time from the post.

Huachuca City's business district consists of retail businesses, restaurants and industrial properties.

BENSON

Benson and the San Pedro River Valley are rich in natural wonders and provide a home for deer,

javelina, reptiles and many other animals, including more than 500 species of birds. In the surrounding mountains and oasis-like San Pedro Riparian areas, are a treasure-trove of hiking trails for the rock-hound, bird watcher, camper, historian or nature lover. The area boasts a beautiful temperate climate year round, making it a perfect vacation spot.

The valley is also attractive to industry. Dubbed the transportation "hub" of Cochise County, there is easy access to major highways, rail transit and airports. The San Pedro & Southwestern Railway recently restored a portion of track from Benson to Douglas for excursions as well as freight transit. The route winds through the pristine San Pedro Riparian National Conservation Area,

ghost towns and flourishing tourist communities.

Although Benson was founded in 1880, civilization in the valley began long before. The Spanish missionary, Father Eusigio Kino, established missions in the late 1600s bringing Christianity and agriculture to the resident Pima Indians. The Pima shared the land with the hostile Chiricahua Apache, who eventually gained control of the area. The U.S. Army waged a difficult campaign against the Chiricahua to protect the homesteaders that began to make their way to the new territory. It was during this time the Mormons settled in St. David, the Butterfield Stage was founded, and the Indian legends of Cochise and Geronimo were born. As the dust of the Butterfield Overland Stage Coach and Pony Express cleared, Benson matured into a bustling railroad town. In 1880 the Transcontinental Southern Pacific Railroad opened the way for two more major rail lines. Its lifeblood was the copper and silver flowing from the neighboring mining communities of Tombstone, Fairbank and Bisbee.

BISBEE

Nestled in the foothills of the Mule Mountains of southeast Arizona, Bisbee resembles a European hamlet more than a dusty 1880's Old West town. Originally called "The Queen of the Copper Camps," Bisbee has a rich history which grew out of its humble beginnings as a mining camp turned boom town in the 1880s. In 1900, it was the largest city between St. Louis and San Francisco. Bisbee was rebuilt in 1908 after being destroyed by fire, and its homes and the downtown area still hold a Victorian charm.

Bisbee today is rich in architecture and culture, with its numerous art galleries, antique stores, gourmet restaurants, crafts shops, museums, and period bed and breakfast accommodations as well as hotels. The Queen Mine Tour attracts thousands of visitors each year who ride down into the old tunnels in a string of mining cars. Events and cultural activities include musical presentations from street dances to a professional classical music series, a major

national poetry festival, several art openings each month, a fiber arts festival, performances by several local theater groups and a nationally recognized annual weekend bicycle race.

Visitors can also enjoy hiking the surrounding area in the cool mile-high mountain air.

DOUGLAS

Douglas, located on the U.S.-Mexico border, was founded in 1901 as a site for a copper smelter and was incorporated in 1905. The townsite was originally an annual round-up spot for ranches. Agriculture and ranching are still important segments of the area's principal economy.

Because of its location, international commerce is an important part of the local economy. Douglas has 15 manufacturing plants and Agua Prieta, Mexico, just across the border, has 26, many of the latter operating under the twin-plan concept.

The historic Gadsden Hotel, a frontier landmark since 1907, is one of the more popular attractions in the city. Visitors also frequent the Cochise County Historical and Archaeological Society Museum.

The lure of shopping and sightseeing in "Old Mexico," plus nearness to several outdoor recreation areas, have made tourism and retirement significant to Douglas' economy. Brief visits to Agua Prieta do not require visas or special documents.

The city has seven elementary schools, two junior high schools a high school, a private elementary school and Christian school; along with Cochise College (Douglas Campus).

NOGALES

Nogales, Arizona, and Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, are twin cities separated only by a fence. The two cities are located about 65 miles southwest of Fort Huachuca.

Nogales, Mexico, is a shopping paradise, with a host of colorful markets and shops featuring leather goods, ceramics, tinware, fabrics, lacquered wood, tile, silverware, sculpture and paintings, and brass and copper.

But Nogales, Mexico, is more than just a village of markets and shops. It is a city of about 250,000 people, many of whom are engaged in handling the international commerce that flows in both directions through

the gates separating the United States and Mexico. Nogales Arizona, has a population of 19,990.

There are many famous ranches in Nogales on both sides of the border. Some are still owned by families of the Spanish dons who came to the new world with the Conquistadores. In the hills are fine riding and hiking trails and good hunting areas. A popular attraction in Nogales, Arizona, is the Primeria Alta historical museum in the original Nogales City Hall Building, located downtown.

TOMBSTONE

Perhaps one of the best known and most popular attractions in this area is just a 25-minute drive from Fort Huachuca on Charleston Road. It is Tombstone – "The Town Too Tough To Die."

Fort Huachuca figured into its founding since it was from there that young Ed Schieffelin set out in the late 1800s to find silver in the San Pedro Hills. He was told by soldiers at the post that all he would find would be his tombstone because of the constant danger of hostile Apaches.

So, when Schieffelin made his first strike in 1877, he named the claim Tombstone.

News of his silver strike spread and quickly brought prospectors, miners, businessmen, fortune hunters, lawmen and the lawless until the population of Tombstone reached 12,000 to 15,000 in 1881. Today, its population is 1,800.

Surging waters in the mines ended the boom in the late 1890s, but not before names like Virgil and Wyatt Earp, Doc Holliday, the OK Corral and the Clanton Gang were household words throughout the nation.

The Tombstone of today is still fascinating to visit, with many of the fabled places, such as the OK Corral, Bird Cage Theater, Crystal Palace Saloon and Boot Hill Cemetery, much as they were in the heyday of the town.

Those wild days of the 1880s are recreated each year with the exciting three-day celebrations: Wyatt Earp Days, Memorial Day weekend; Rendezvous of gunfighters, Labor Day weekend; and Helderado Days, the third Friday weekend in October.

DAVIS-MONTHAN AIR FORCE BASE

Davis-Monthan Air Force Base is a key Air Combat Command installation, located within the city limits of Tucson, Arizona. The 355th Wing, the host unit, provides medical, logistical and operational support to all D-M units.

The wing's missions are to train A/OA-10 pilots and provide A/OA-10 close air support and forward air control. The wing is also tasked to provide command, control, and communications countermeasures with its EC-130-H aircraft and, employing the EC-130 aircraft, provide airborne command, control and communications. Approximately 6,000 military and 1,700 civilian employees work at Davis-Monthan.

Two major air commands, the Air Reserve and the Air National Guard are represented by associate units at D-M. Twelfth Air Force is charged with commanding, administrating, and supervision tactical forces west of the Mississippi River. As one of ACC's numbered air forces, 12th AF operates combat-ready forces and equipment for air superiority working with U.S. and allied forces.

The Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Center, an Air Force Material Command unit, is responsible for the storage of more than 4,900 excess Department of Defense and Coast Guard aircraft.

The 305th Rescue Squadron, an air Force Reserve unit, flies the HH-60G helicopter, with a primary mission of search and rescue.

Detachment 1, 120th Fighter Interceptor Group, an Air National Guard unit, flies the F-16 "Fighting Falcon." These aircraft can "scramble" in less than five minutes to identify and intercept any airborne threat to U.S. security.

Other federal agencies using the base include the Federal Aviation Administration, the U.S. Customs Service Air Service Branch, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center and a detachment of Naval Air Systems Command.

TUCSON

Tucson, just 75 miles to the northwest, and an hour-and-half away by car, is a modern, progressive city – yet it retains the culture and flavor of the Old West.


With a history dating back to Indian settlers in 800 A.D., and later the Spanish Conquistadores, Tucson was established as a walled presidio by the Spanish in 1776 – the year the American colonies declared their independence from England.

The city did not become part of the United States, however, until 1853, following the Gadsden Purchase.

Tucson is located in a desert valley surrounded by mountain ranges on all sides, with an elevation varying from 2,400 feet in the Tucson Valley, to more than 9,000 feet atop Mount Lemmon.

Renowned for its superb weather and described as "one of the most rapidly growing communities in the nation today," Tucson is the second largest city in Arizona, with a population of approximately 712,600. The city offers varied entertainment, recreational facilities, spectator sports and social and cultural events throughout the year.

Tucson is also the home of the University of Arizona. With an enrollment of more than 35,000 students, the university is organized into 112 academic subdivisions and departments, and 33 divisions of research and special service. It offers bachelors degree in 142 fields of study, masters degree in 140, and doctorates in 97. It is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and is a member of the Pacific 10 Conference.

Call Transfer (Three-Way Conference)

- Flash the hook switch (you will get a unique tone).
- Dial the five (5) digit number the call is to be transferred to.
- Upon hearing the audible ring back the transferring station can either:
• Announce the call and hang up, or...
- Flash the hook switch once to establish a three-way conference.

Call Pickup

- Pick up the handset.
- Dial (*73).
- Answer the call.

Ring Again

- Flash the hook switch. You will hear a distinctive dial tone.
- Dial (*75) to activate Ring Again.
- After hearing a confirmation tone, place the receiver on hook.
- When the busy station becomes idle, you will hear ringing from your phone. When you pick up the receiver, the telephone switch will redial the number you dialed.

Last Number Redial

- Pick up the handset.
- Press the number sign (#) key twice or *80.
- The last number you dialed will be automatically dialed by the system.

Call Conference (Up to 6 Parties)

- Pick up the handset.
- Dial (*72).
- Dial the first conferee.
- After conferee answers, flash the hook switch, dial (*72).
- Repeat steps of dialing conferee, hook flash, and dial (*72) for each additional party.
- If a conferee is busy or there is no answer, dial release code (#72) to drop the party.

TELEPHONES WITH PROGRAMMABLE KEYS

Some features (e.g., Hold, Call Forward, Ring Again) may be activated with dedicated keys on programmable telephones.

FEATURE DESCRIPTIONS

CALL FORWARD-Call Forward allows incoming calls to your telephone number to be automatically forwarded while you are away, to another telephone number of your choice. This feature can be applied to all calls or selectively to don't answer or busy calls.

CALL PICKUP-Allows you to answer incoming calls to another telephone in your office. (The ringing station must be a member of your call pickup group before you can answer the incoming call.)

RING AGAIN-When you are making a call and encounter a busy signal, using this feature will cause the switch to notify you when the busy number is free by sending a special tone to your phone. When you pick up the receiver, the switch will redial the number called again.

LAST NUMBER REDIAL-The Last Number Redial feature allows you to redial your last called number by pressing a single key twice rather than dialing the entire number again.

CALL TRANSFER-Used to transfer incoming calls to another number. This feature allows you to either transfer the call and hang up or to remain on the line for a Three-Way Conference.

THREE-WAY CONFERENCE-Allows you to establish a three-way conference with either an incoming call or two calls you originate.

CONFERENCE CALLING-This feature will allow you to initiate a conference call for up to six parties.

TELEPHONE TRUNK ACCESS

1. Trunks are the communication channel or common path for communication traffic between switching equipment associated with private branch exchange (PBX) telephone systems and the world. They provide the path to transmit switched data or voice communications from one location to another.
2. With the advent of digital switching and single-line phones, many trunk classes of service are available but not offered on all telephones.
 - a. A rapid busy signal or announcement after dialing an access code means that
 - (1) The telephone is not equipped with this service. Place the call from a telephone with the proper access. A Telephone Control Officer can assist with identifying a telephone's access.
 - (2) All trunks are busy. Place the call later.
 - b. Do not call an operator for assistance if you receive a rapid busy signal. Operators are not permitted to dial an access code not available to your telephone. Trunks that are busy to you will also be busy to the operator.
 - c. Operators will assist with problematic calls; for example, when you normally have access but get no ring, static recording, etc. The operator will either help you report your telephone and then try to assist you or try the call and request you report your telephone problem as soon as possible.

LONG DISTANCE CALLS

1. Long distance calls require authorization. They will be recorded on DA Form 360 (Report of Authorized Official Toll Calls). These forms will be maintained by the Telephone Control Officer in current files (file number 251v) for 1 year to verify billings.
2. Personal long distance calls will not be charged to the U.S. Government. Toll charges for unofficial or unauthorized calls will be collected from the individual making the call. (See the section on Telephone Control Officer (TCO) numbers and billing verifications.)

JOINT UNIFORM TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS PRECEDENCE SYSTEM

This system establishes precedence levels for communications. All DSN users will select the precedence level that applies to the subject of the call when making operator-assisted calls or using telephones with precedence features. (See Part 11, DSN Information, for examples of use.)

GLOBAL ACCESS

Local service requests for access to Global Service Access must be approved by the commander or director of the requesting organization and appropriate Secretary of the General

Staff (SGS) or Executive Officer (XO). Requests will be submitted to the Directorate of Information Management (DOIM), ATTN: ATZS-IM for approval.

MINIMIZE

1. Reduction and Control of Information Transfer in an Emergency, known as MINIMIZE, is a procedure used during periods of crisis or other abnormal periods to reduce the volume of nonessential information transmitted electronically. This action is required for prompt transmission of essential traffic. MINIMIZE applies to all users of Department of Defense (DOD) communications systems. Procedures for MINIMIZE are in AR 25-10, Reduction and Control of Information Transfer in an Emergency (MINIMIZE).
2. The Joint Chiefs of Staff or the command concerned will transmit the notification of MINIMIZE. When MINIMIZE is imposed, users of DOD electrical communications facilities must determine that the information needs to be electronically transmitted to avoid a serious, adverse impact on mission accomplishment or safety of life and the addressee would not receive the information in time to achieve its purpose by other methods.

OPERATOR COURTESY

Telephone operators are instructed to be uniformly courteous and respectful. Similar action by the subscriber is an incentive to superior service. Do not reprimand or converse with operators. Direct problems or complaints to the Chief Operator, extension 8-7000.

DIRECTORY SERVICE

1. The telephone directory is maintained by the DOIM. Report any changes to your TCO.
2. Information on changes of telephone numbers should be promptly disseminated throughout the installation. Submit changes by memorandum to Commander, U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca, ATTN: ATZSIMC-SP for publication in the Weekly Bulletin. Include a diskette (which will be returned). Weekly Bulletin items can be submitted by electronic mail to weeklyb@huachuca-emhl.army.mil.
3. Additional copies of this directory are available from the Publications Warehouse, building 31013, extension 33056. Submit requests for directories on a DA Form 17 (Requisition for Publications and Blank Forms). The directory is available to all users of the post telephone system. Requests from outside elements and private individuals must be submitted under the Freedom of Information Act to Commander, U.S. Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca, ATTN: ATZS-IMC-SR.
4. Cochise County telephone directories are issued by the DOIM when they are received, usually in the fall. Copies of the Tucson and Phoenix telephone directories may be purchased from U.S. West Direct by credit card. For information on directories for other areas, call 1-800-422-8793.

SYSTEMS AND EQUIPMENT

1. Key systems and equipment must be programmed, budgeted, and funded by users. All requests for key systems will be scrutinized to determine whether they are mission essential. An economic analysis will be performed by the DOW Information Operations Division. Requirements for the installation of a key system or equipment must be submitted through appropriate channels to the DOIM, ATTN: ATZS-IMP, as an Information Capability Request (CAPR).

2. Telephone answering devices, specialty devices, and equipment will not be connected to the local telephone system without complete justification by the user in a CAPR. Requests must be validated as mission-essential by the user's commander or director and approved and certified for use on the telephone system by the DOIM. The DOW ensures the technical compatibility of such devices with the communications systems. Such specialty items are obtained as Tier III (property book items) and are funded, operated, and maintained with funds available to the user.

CLASSES OF SERVICE

1. Official Telephone Service. Official Government telephone service includes classes A, C, and D. Explanations of these services are as follows:
 - a. Class A telephone service is authorized for the transaction of official business when access to commercial long distance or Government-owned telephone trunks is required. Class A service is divided as follows:
 - (1) Class A1, provided to conduct official business with direct access to the DSN, commercial, Federal Telephone System (FTS), and Arizona services. Access codes 99, 98, 97, and 96.
 - (2) Class A2, provided to conduct official business with direct access to the DSN and commercial services. Access codes 99 and 98.
 - (3) Class A3, provided to conduct official business confined to intra-PBX and local commercial service. Restricted from DSN, toll, commercial, and FTS services. Access code 99.
 - (4) Class AA1, Global Service Access, requires the approval of the appropriate SGS/XO.
 - b. Class C telephone service (official restricted) is authorized for the transmission of official Government business throughout the Army installation. This service is restricted from access to local commercial, FTS, DSN, and commercial long distance services.
 - c. Class D telephone service (official special) is installed as required throughout an Army installation for special types of services; for example, fire, guard, and crash alarm services.
2. Unofficial Telephone Service (Class B). Class B telephone service is not available when services from a commercial telephone company can be offered. Unofficial telephone service when offered is for use by military housing occupants and other unofficial subscribers. Class B service would be provided on a reimbursable basis.

PROBLEM REPORTING FOR DOIM-SUPPORTED SERVICES

1. The DOIM maintains a centralized Customer Assistance Team to provide support for repair and assistance of automation and communications resources. For assistance with a problem, call the Customer Assistance Team at extension 3-1111 and provide the following information:
 - a. Has the problem been reported previously? If so, provide the control number given to you at the time of your initial call.
 - b. What type of problem is it? Is it in one of the categories below (if so, provide applicable information), or does it fall into another category, such as communications lines, cable television, etc.?

- (1) Telephone problem. Provide your name, organization, working telephone number, building and room number, description of the problem, and nonworking telephone number. If the telephone is a Secure Telephone Unit (STU), call it in to the 304th Military Intelligence Battalion, extension 3-6604; and be sure to identify it as a STU.
 - (2) Office automation software problem. Provide your name, organization, telephone number, building and room number, description of the problem, model number, and serial number. If the equipment is still under warranty, please identify the equipment as such.
 - (3) DSN problem. Provide your name, phone number from which call was placed, DSN number and location of the called party, time the trouble occurred, and a description of the problem.
 - (4) Local area network problem. Provide your name, organization telephone number, building and room number, and a description of the problem.
 - (5) Electronic mail (E-Mail) problem. Provide your name, organization, telephone number, building and room number, host name, E-Mail box ID, user ID, and description of the problem. (Is the problem local or with the Defense Information Systems Network (DISN))?
2. The Customer Assistance Team will notify the proper technical staff or vendor to respond to the problem. Users are prohibited from calling vendors. If the DOIM does not provide the service, the Customer Assistance Team will provide the name and telephone number of the organization that can respond to the problem.

TAMPERING WITH EQUIPMENT

Under no circumstances will subscribers move, alter, place attachments on, make additions to, or change telephone equipment, communications equipment, controllers, modems, SYTEK cabling, and modems. Tampering with or any unauthorized moves of the data equipment can result in immediate disconnection of telephone service.

EXCAVATION

To prevent damage to buried communications facilities, contact the following offices to obtain clearance before excavating on Fort Huachuca:

1. DOIM, Information Operations Division, Facilities Branch (ATZS-IMN-F), building 30120, extension 3-1730.
2. Directorate of Installation Support (DIS) Contract Management Division, extension 3-1442.

SERVICE PRIORITIES AND RESTORATION CODES

1. Priority codes. Priorities for processing DA Forms 3938 (Local Service Request) (LSR) are assigned by the commander, director, or TCO, IMO or FSPO delegated with the authority. Periodic priority lists should be submitted by the TCO/IMO/FSPO to ATZS-IMC-TC at a minimum of once a month, in the order the commander or director wants work to be accomplished, to ensure scheduling of work requirements and meeting organizational priorities concerned. A basic level of service will be provided in proportion to main lines and resources available within the DOIM. Priority codes are listed in the

instructions for the DA Form 3938. Work orders submitted without priority listings will be processed as routine and worked into schedules of each geographical zone.

2. Restoration codes. Restoration codes for telephone maintenance must be identified on the LSR when requesting new services. The restoration code is for the purpose of restoring services and identifying critical circuits reported for repair service; therefore, this code sets precedence. The TCO/IMO/FSPO can submit a list to the Work Order Section identifying critical circuits and restoration codes of established circuits. The list must be approved by the commander or director. For new service, enter one of the following service restoration priority codes:

RESTORATION CODES

CODE DEFINITION

1. Mission-essential and no redundancy exists. Maximum restoration time is 24 hours.
2. Mission-essential and no redundancy exists. Maximum restoration time is 48 hours.
3. Impedes mission and no redundancy exists. Maximum restoration time is 72 hours.
4. Impedes mission, redundancy exists, routine. Maximum restoration time is 15 days.

The instructions for DA Form 3938 contain guidance on assigning restoration codes.

DA FORM 3938 (LOCAL SERVICE REQUEST)

1. All requirements to move, install, remove, and change (realign) telecommunications equipment and instruments within the capacity of the existing capabilities require completion of a DA Form 3938.
2. Technical advice for the TCO, the Functional System Proponent Officer (FSPO), and Information Management Officer (IMO) is available from the DOIM Work Order Technician at extension 3-3938.
3. The form may be filled out by the subscriber (a person that has/ needs a telephone or a special circuit), but will always have to be reviewed by the subscriber's TCO to ensure completeness, viability, TCO signature and TCO number. The form is then passed to the IMO (the subscriber's Commander/Director or their representative) for final authority. The paragraph numbers in the table below are keyed to the DA Form 3938 shown in figure 1.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DA FORM 3938

Number Instructions

1. SERVICE PRIORITY.
 03. CANNOT OPERATE WITHOUT THIS SERVICE. Completion required within 30 days.
 06. IMPEDES THE FUNCTION OF CURRENT MISSION. Completion required within 60 days.
 13. ROUTINE REQUEST FOR SERVICE. Completion required within 90 days.

This number is put on the border at the top of the page. The service priority is assigned by the IMO or the FSPO delegated with the responsibility. Periodic priority lists (monthly) are recommended, in the order the IMO wishes the work to be accomplished to meet organizational priorities.

2. DATE SERVICE REQUIRED Block: Enter the date service is required. Do not enter a service date of the same day as the service is requested. A minimum of 15 days lead time is required on priority 03, a minimum of 30 days on a priority 06, and a minimum of 60 days on a priority 13.
3. NAME AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF PERSON WITH EXACT LOCATION KNOWLEDGE Block: Enter name, rank (if military), and duty telephone number of the point of contact.

4. **INSTALL Block:** If this is an installation, check this block.
 5. **REMOVE Block:** If this is to remove telephone numbers or special circuits, check this block.
 6. **MOVE Block:** If this is to move telephone numbers or special circuits, check this block.
 7. **REMOVE, INSTALL Blocks:** If telephone numbers or special circuits are to be removed from one location and installed into another location, check both blocks.
 8. **SPECIAL REQUESTS Block:** Describe work to be accomplished; enter telephone numbers, special circuit numbers, fund site, and any special instructions for work to be done in this block.
 9. **Restoration code must be stated under special requests.**
Code 1. Mission-Essential, no redundancy exists. Use for life-threatening situations; for example, airfield, hospital, Military Police, the Emergency Operations Center, or general officers. Maximum restoration time is 24 hours.
Code 2. Mission-Essential, no redundancy exists. Use for intrusion detection systems, fire alarms, charge of quarters, etc. Maximum restoration is 48 hours.
Code 3. Impedes Mission, no redundancy exists. Maximum restoration time is 72 hours.
Code 4. Impedes mission, redundancy exists, routine. Maximum restoration time is 15 days.
If there is no restoration code assigned, it will automatically go to code 4.
 10. **PRESENT LOCATION OF EQUIPMENT Block:** Building number and room number where telephone number and/or special circuit currently exists.
 11. **PRESENT DIRECTORY LISTING Block:** The information previously listed in the telephone directory with the number(s).
 12. **PROPOSED LOCATION OF EQUIPMENT Block:** if different than Item 10.
 13. **PROPOSED DIRECTORY LISTING Block:** The information which shows the listing as it should appear in the telephone directory. If there is no change, write "NO CHANGE." If additional room is needed, use the Special Requests block (number 8).
 14. **CLASS OF SERVICE DESIRED Block:** AA1 GLOBAL, Global has to have authorization of the SGS/XO and the Director of DOIM. All = All trunks 99 (Sierra Vista), 98 (DSN), 97 (Arizona), 96 (Continental U.S.) A2 = 99 (Sierra Vista), 98 (DSN) A3 = 99 (Sierra Vista) C Fort Huachuca
 15. **TOTAL TELEPHONE(S) AT ACTIVITY CONCERNED Block:** The number of instruments the subscriber feels this LSR will affect.
 16. **DATE OF REQUEST Block:** Self-explanatory
 17. **TYPED/PRINTED NAME OF REQUESTER Block:** Self explanatory.
 18. **SIGNATURE OF VALIDATING OFFICIAL Block:** TCO Signature.
 19. **INSTRUCTIONS Block.** IMO/ FSPO/TCO Code: Two letter, two digit code. The IMO, FSPO, or TCO enters this number, which is assigned by the DOIM, such as EE31.
 20. Enter the IMO/FSPO/TCO office symbol in this block. All customer comeback copies will be returned to the IMO/FSPO for the purpose of compiling lists at command and directorate levels.
1. Communications requirements beyond the capacity of the existing system (such as installing a key system, redesigning office networks, etc.) or out of cycle requirements (such as moving from one building to another) must be coordinated through DOIM Program Management Office,

extension 3-1358. This must be done prior to submitting the DA Form 3938.

2. Coordination with the DIS is appropriate in some instances and requires the user to allow more lead time for any projects. Planning the site preparation for remodeled or new facilities requires the inclusion of the communications equipment facility area; such as communication closet location(s), lighting, electrical outlets, and conduits (electrical and communications). The user must arrange for site preparation through the DIS to include the construction and/or installation of communications closets and conduit. IMOs or FSPOs requiring information regarding communications systems requirements (a communications closet, a larger cable, or duct runs) may be obtained by contacting the DOIM Planner/Estimator/Inspector at extension 8-8119.
3. IMOs submitting LSRs for sensitive compartmented information facilities (SCIFs) must coordinate with the appropriate Special Security Office (SSO) to ensure telecommunications requirements and equipment adhere to Security Regulatory Specifications. There must be an SSO Officer's Signature in the special requests block of the LSR for the SCIF indicating the SSO has validated and approved the requested communication equipment requirements and they do not violate tempest security.
4. For requests for repair assistance of existing equipment or telephone failure in normal operation, call DOIM Customer Assistance, extension 3-1111.

TCO NUMBERS AND BILLING VERIFICATIONS

1. The TCO Number is a very important part of the DA Form 3938, as it is how a telephone number is tracked and billed every month.
 - a. The Post Telephone Control Officer (PTCO) generates subscriber bills from TELMARS. The report is broken down by TCO numbers and distributed post-wide for verification of all official or authorized calls. Authorized calls differ from official calls and must be reported on DA Form 360 (Report of Authorized Official Toll Telephone Calls). This form is checked with TELMARS for that particular TCO number; if there is no listing on the DA 360, it is an unauthorized call. If necessary, the TELMARS data base will be updated to reflect changes in a TCO's list of authorized numbers.
 - b. If unauthorized or unofficial calls are noted and returned to the PTCO, the PTCO will prepare a DA Form 1131 (Cash Collection Voucher). This is prepared to reflect all charges to the individual making the unauthorized calls, and this person must handcarry the document to Finance and Accounting Office and pay in full the balance due. A paid receipt must be returned to the PTCO to verify payment has been made. This is one reason all personnel clearing post must be cleared through the DOIM PTCO.
2. If customers require new service without a previous TCO number, they have a variety of options:
 - a. They can have their sponsor provide the LSR (DA Form 3938).
 - b. They can have a temporary TCO number issued to them.
 - c. They can have a full-time TCO number issued to them.

If options 2 or 3 are used a DA Form 1687 (Notice of Authority - Receipt for Supplies) has to be completed and forwarded to the DOIM

Information Support Division, building 22408. This can be handcarried or sent through the post Mail and Distribution Center to ATZS-IMC-TT. This form should indicate all telephone numbers under the TCO's responsibility. If new numbers are installed, they should be noted on the back of the DA Form 1687 and an updated copy should be sent to PTCO (it may be a reproduced copy). In the reverse, if a number has been abandoned; for example, a person has moved to a different prefix or an office has moved from one building to another building and changed prefix numbers, this should also be reported. Under all circumstances of moving, adding, or changing a number a DA Form 3938 must be completed and turned into the Telephone Work Order Desk.

3. All TCOs should have an accurate account of the telephone numbers they are responsible for and promptly report any numbers no longer in use. This is a primary reason for data base inaccuracies. For example, when numbers are not being used but are still drawing dial tone, this puts undue strain on the main switches and makes the technicians think they are out of numbers and report this to the DOIM. When these numbers are found, they are put into nouse, noring group for 30 days. After 30 days the number is turned off and returned to the switch for reissue, then the TCO who did not report the number as not in use wants to use the number and since the number has been reissued, the DOIM gets another trouble call.

SPECIAL SERVICE CIRCUITS

1. All DA Forms 3938 submitted for special service circuits for other than voice transmission must meet the following criteria identifying:
 - a. Type of Circuit: Data circuits identified as 2-wire, 4-wire, point-to-point, multipoint, long haul commercial, alarm, or intrusion detection systems, etc.
 - b. System Connectivity: Access to various Information Processing Center equipment must be coordinated with IMOs prior to submitting the LSR. All LSRs requesting connectivity via SYTEK, Ethernet, local or wide area networks, DISK or twisted pair connecting to a host computer system must have been processed and coordinated by the individual organization's IMO and the DOIM Program Management Office (PMO).
 - c. Equipment Specifications: The IMO will identify Data Terminal Equipment (DTE) and Data Circuit Equipment (DCE) and reflect any manufacturer specification requirements. Requirements will reflect whether circuits can operate over voice grade lines. Circuit requirements should reflect such information as system access, leased or customer provided equipment, modem type, make, serial number, baud rate, or bits per second transmission rate.
 - d. Network Requirements: System accessibility and any protocol prerequisites, passwords, software, or hardware requirements, should be coordinated with the PMO prior to submitting any LSR accessing the various local or wide area networks, such as the DISK SYTEK, Ethernet, etc. Diagrams reflecting circuit profile and circuit configuration from DCE to DTE are requested.
2. The information regarding the special service circuits should be placed in the Special Requests block (number 9 in the example). Any attachments (diagrams) should also be listed in the Special Requests block.

E-MAIL USER INFORMATION

- As a DISN host user, you have access which enables you to send E-mail worldwide.
- DISN E-Mail flows through a series of computers on the DISN network. These computers vary in types and mail transfer agents (i.e., PROFS, MMDF, INFOMAIL, etc.). E-Mail users should contact their respective IMOs for E-Mail availability or Information Support Division (extension 3-1212) for assistance in obtaining information concerning E-Mail.

FACSIMILE SERVICE

(NOTE: Facsimile (FAX) numbers for unclassified transmittal have been included in the directory listings when provided by the organizations.)

- The Fort Huachuca Telecommunications Center (TCC) provides classified facsimile service. The TCC is located in room 1214, building 61801 (Greely Hall). Operating hours are 0700-1600; the TCC is closed Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.
- Army Regulation (AR) 25-11, Record Communications and the Privacy Communications System (chapter 11, Facsimile

Communications) contains user guidance on facsimile forms required when using the TCC to transmit classified facsimile messages.



DEFENSE SWITCHED NETWORK

1. The Defense Switched Network (DSN) is the principal long-haul, voice communications network within the Defense Communications System, providing non-secure direct distance dialing service worldwide through a system of government-owned and leased automatic switching facilities. The purpose of DSN is to handle essential command and control, operations, intelligence logistic, diplomatic, and administrative traffic. The DSN system should be the user's first choice of long distance voice communications.

2. The DSN system will be used only for official business or in the interest of the government.

3. DSN may be used to place HMW calls from isolated or remote locations. Such calls may be approved when commercial service and the Military Affiliate Radio System are either physically unavailable or so limited as to be considered unavailable. The following conditions apply to HMW use of DSN.

a. Calls may be placed only through the local installation operator or, in the absence of an installation operator, from a telephone under a commander's supervision to ensure compliance with the controls described below.

b. Calls must be placed only during normal non-duty hours at the originating location and timed to avoid the normal duty period at the terminating location.

c. Calls must be placed only at Routine precedence and must not exceed 15 minutes in duration or incur any toll charges to the Government. Off-netting at the distant end is at the discretion of local commanders, who are encouraged to permit HMW calls.

4. DSN will be restricted to:

a. Those calls that are essential, requiring a timeliness that cannot be obtained by other means, and would stand the scrutiny afforded a commercial toll call.

b. Calls should be of the shortest duration possible to conduct business.

c. The use of precedence level in consonance with the subject matter of the call as established in the National Voice Communications Precedence System.

5. DSN will not be authorized for:

a. The use of, directly or indirectly, any non-appropriated fund activity (clubs, exchanges, and other unofficial activities) provided telephone service at post, camp, station, or base level except when approved by the installation DOIM.

b. Calls within an installation, metropolitan area, or confined geographical area, where other existing government-provided local telephone service is adequate.

c. Unofficial or personal calls.

6. The National Communications Voice Precedence System is directed for the use of all authorized users of voice communication facilities of the Department of Defense. Since the effectiveness of the system depends on the cooperation of persons authorized to employ it, users must be familiar with the purpose served by each level of the precedence category, and the types of calls which may be assigned the respective precedence.

7. Precedence dialing instructions:

a. Dial 93 + (DSN area code) + 7 digit telephone number for Priority.

b. Dial 92 + (DSN area code) + 7 digit telephone number for Immediate.

c. Dial 91 + (DSN area code) + 7 digit telephone number for Flash.

NOTE: DSN area code not required when calling within the same DSN area code.

8. Precedence dialing may not be available on all installations.

9. The Defense Switched Network is constantly changing to provide better service, occasionally this means a number change. If a number change recording is reached, contact the DSN Information Operator, (312 + 231-1311). Report changes to the office listed under "REPORTING ERRORS/CHANGES."

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

With the exception of the Pacific area, Fort Richardson, Fort Wainwright, and Fort Greely subscribers cannot access Overseas locations directly. Calls to these areas must be placed through the servicing switchboard.
