SUBJECT: POLICY - Installation Juvenile Curfew

1. Installation juvenile curfew, 17-year-olds and under, establishes the policy and procedures for the juvenile curfew. The Military Police will enforce the juvenile curfew as stated in this policy letter. This curfew does not apply to juveniles accompanied by a parent, guardian, or custodian.

2. Responsibilities:

a. Parents, custodians, guardians will ensure juveniles comply with the provisions of this policy letter.

b. Parents, guardians, or custodians are responsible for juveniles found violating the curfew. Repeated offenses may result in administrative and/or disciplinary action.

c. Adults on the installation will contact the Military Police if they note a violation.

3. Terms.

a. Juvenile. Any person who has not yet reached 18 years of age who is not a soldier or the spouse of a soldier.

b. Parent. Any natural or adoptive parent of a juvenile.

c. Guardian. Any person other than a parent, who has legal guardianship of the person of a juvenile.

d. Custodian. Any person, not a juvenile, who has lawful care and custody (i.e. babysitter) of a juvenile.

4. Juveniles cannot be on Fort Huachuca either on foot or in a motor vehicle without a parent, guardian, or custodian between the hours listed below without a Fort Huachuca Form 190-16-R-E, Curfew Permit, attached to this policy. Additional copies are available from the Military Police Station, building 22336, or the Youth Activities Center, building 49013.

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The form must explain the requirements for the juvenile to be on Fort Huachuca during the hours set forth below and be signed by the parent, guardian, or custodian.

a. Sunday - Thursday: 2200 - 0500

b. Friday - Saturday: 2400 - 0500

5. The Military Police will detain and cite juveniles violating the curfew using a DA Form 3975 (Military Police Report). Parents will be required to sign for their dependents on DD Form 629 (Receipt of Prisoner or Detained Person). Should a second offense occur, the juvenile offender will be required to appear before the Youth Council with his or her parents, guardians, or custodians, where appropriate action will be determined.

6. This policy supersedes Fort Huachuca Regulation 190-13, Installation Juvenile Curfew, 31 August 1995.
